
Subject: Disposal 1994 Chevy P-30 Evidence Van Unit 142

The police department's 1994 Chevy Evidence Van was replaced by our new Mobile Command Vehicle. All usable equipment has now been transferred from this vehicle leaving only minimal equipment that is outdated and no longer needed.

Due to its unique design and lettering, this vehicle has limited usefulness as anything other than a police evidence vehicle. At the time we purchased our new vehicle, Faber Specialty Vehicles, Inc. estimated the value of this vehicle at approximately \$10,000. Based upon this suggested price, we alerted various DuPage County police agencies that this vehicle was available for sale for \$10,000. As of the deadline of Wednesday, May 13, 2009 only Deputy Chief Bill Holmer of the Glen Ellyn Police Department committed to purchase the vehicle as is for \$10,000.

This vehicle was purchased in 1994 using seized drug assets and the proceeds from the sale of this vehicle must be returned to the drug seizure fund.

I respectfully request that the Village Board authorize the sale of this vehicle to the Village of Glen Ellyn for \$10,000. We are requesting waiver of first reading to expedite the disposal.

ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND/OR DISPOSAL
OF MUNICIPAL OWNED PERSONAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the majority of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain the following described personal property:

Police Department
One 1994 Chevy P-30 Evidence Van serial number 1GBKP32K1R3301445 and all attached police equipment now owned by the Village of Lombard; and said personal property having minimal resale value; and

WHEREAS, The Village routinely declares such type of personal property surplus and the best interest of the Village of Lombard will be served by its sale to the Village of Glen Ellyn, Illinois in "as is" condition for \$10,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

now owned by the Village of Lombard is no longer necessary or useful to the Village of Lombard, that there is minimal resale value for said personal property in that there is minimal market therefor, and that the best interest of Lombard will be served by its sale to the Village of Glen Ellyn, Illinois in "as is" condition for \$10,000.00.

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to dispose of the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard in the manner as set forth above.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
