

- **WHEREAS**, in 1872 J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and
- **WHEREAS,** this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and
- WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and
- WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and
- **WHEREAS,** trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, countless other wood products; and
- **WHEREAS,** trees in our Village increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and
- **WHEREAS,** trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Village of Lombard has been recognized as a Tree City USA community by the National Arbor Day Foundation and desires to continue its tree-planting program; and
- WHEREAS, an event to increase the awareness of the benefits of trees will take place at 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 25, 2012 at the corner of Lincoln and Wilson with the students from Glenbard East High School assisting in obtaining information and calculating the values and tagging the trees;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, William J. Mueller, President of the Village of Lombard, do hereby proclaim May 6, 2011 as ARBOR DAY in the Village of Lombard and urge all residents to support efforts to care for our trees and woodlands and to support our Village's community forestry program. I further encourage residents to plant trees to gladden our hearts and promote the well-being of present and future generations.
