Included in the FY2021 budget is the replacement of four Police Department squad cars. One of the four squads (PP755) is out of service already because it was totaled in an accident on July 3, 2020. The 2020 model year and later Ford Police Interceptor squad cars feature a hybrid drive system. The village purchased two of these hybrids in 2020 and they have proven to be 60% more fuel efficient than the non-hybrid version in our patrol fleet. This increase in fuel efficiency equates to approximately \$7,000 in savings per car over its five-year life cycle. Below is a summary of the cars to be replaced and the amount budgeted. Orders are being taken now for the 2021 model year however production will not begin until September of 2020. The lead time for these vehicles has been six months or more so staff would like Board approval to order these cars now.

The Ford Interceptor Utility is available for joint purchase through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC contract #152). The current contract winner for the SPC is Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL).

I recommend the Board of Trustees waive bid and award a contract to Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL) in the amount of \$163,080 for four new Ford Hybrid Police Interceptor Utilities. I also recommend declaring Village unit numbers PP753, PP754, PP755 and PP756 as surplus per the attached ordinance and authorizing their sale. Units PP753, PP754 and PP756 will be sold at public auction. The squad that has been totaled in an accident (PP755) will be sold to a salvage yard or to the Village's insurance provider as part of the accident settlement. Waiver of first reading is requested on this ordinance. Please submit this item to the Village Board for their consideration at the August 20, 2020 meeting.
