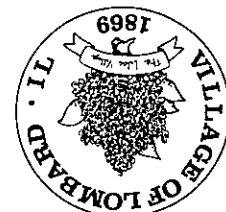

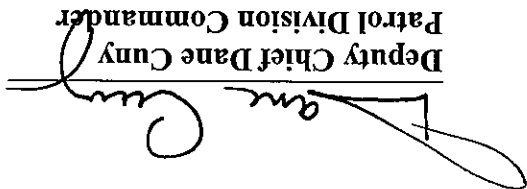

Subject: Disposal 2003 Ford K-9 Squad Car

The police department's 2003 Ford K-9 squad was updated to a new vehicle as part of the regular change over of old squads. The old K-9 car contained specialized K-9 equipment that was no longer needed. On December 6, 2007, this vehicle was one of six squads declared surplus by the Village Board and was destined for auction. When Central Garage was preparing to remove the K-9 cage and other special equipment, it was determined that certain K-9 odors were quite prevalent in the vehicle, making its appeal at auction questionable.

Fleet Supervisor John Mannino felt that the vehicle may have more usefulness as a K-9 squad than an odorous old squad car with the old equipment removed. John also felt that the 2003 Ford squads generally bring approximately \$3,000 at auction. Based upon his suggestion, we alerted police agencies in northern Illinois that this vehicle was available for sale for \$3,000 on a first come, first served basis. On March 14, 2008 Deputy Chief Malcolm White of the Hazel Crest Police Department viewed the K-9 and committed to purchase the vehicle as is for \$3,000.

I respectfully request that the Village Board authorize the sale of this vehicle to the Village of Hazel Crest for \$3,000. We are requesting waiver of first reading to expedite the disposal.

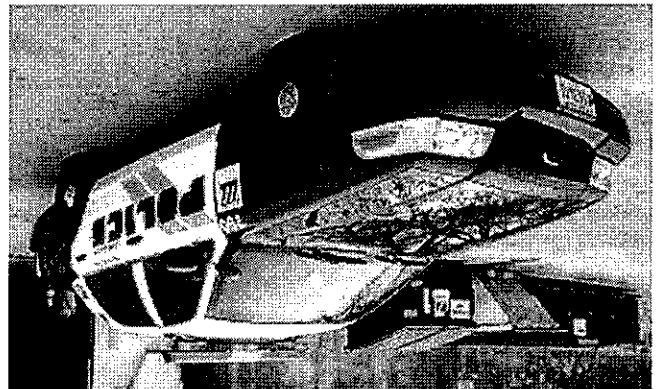
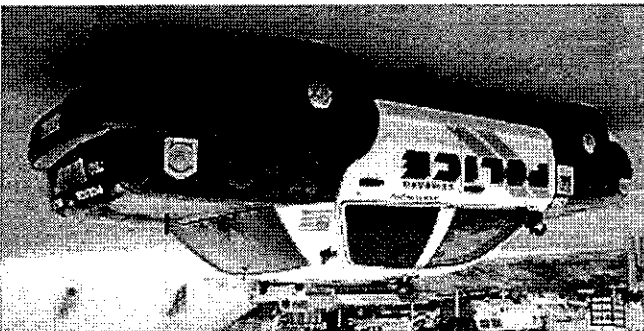

ORDINANCE _____

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND/OR DISPOSAL
OF MUNICIPAL OWNED PERSONAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the majority of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain the following described personal property:

One 2003 Ford Crown Victoria K-9 Squad Car serial number 2FAF71W93X216586 and all attached police equipment now owned by the Village of Lombard; and said personal property having minimal resale value; and

WHEREAS, The Village routinely declares such type of personal property surplus and the best interest of the Village of Lombard will be served by its sale to the Village of Hazel Crest, Illinois in "as is" condition for \$3,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

now owned by the Village of Lombard is no longer necessary or useful to the Village of Lombard, that there is minimal resale value for said personal property in that there is minimal market therefor, and that the best interest of Lombard will be served by its sale to the Village of Hazel Crest, Illinois in "as is" condition for \$3,000.00.

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to dispose of the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard in the manner as set forth above.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
