Re: Disposal of Speed Enforcement Trailer

The Lombard Police Department currently possesses a Decatur Speed Enforcement Trailer (s/n 1B9BR101 5H659). The trailer was purchased in 2006 and over the past few years has been deployed less and less. The trailer is designed to be towed and dropped on a street to warn motorists of their speed. The approximate footprint of the trailer is 6 feet wide by 8 feet long. This unfortunately has limited the areas in which it can be deployed. Over the past 8 years the trailer has been hit multiple times by motor vehicles and needed computer replacements resulting in expensive repair bills.

We no longer are utilizing the trailer in any capacity and it has not been deployed in over a year. We are currently in the process of purchasing a portable speed sign which will give us the ability to record and analyze speed data. This in turn will allow us to give the residents of Lombard accurate information in a timely manner.

We posted an ad for the trailer and distributed the ad to all surrounding Police Departments. The Village of South Barrington inspected and offered the Village of Lombard \$1000.00 for the trailer.

I would recommend the Village of Lombard authorize the sale of the speed trailer to the Village of South Barrington in the amount of \$1000.

A waiver of first reading is being requested to facilitate the sale.

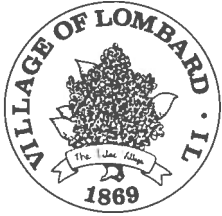
