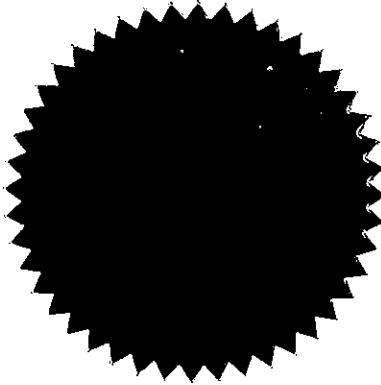

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND/OR DISPOSAL
OF MUNICIPAL OWNED PERSONAL PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the majority of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain the following described personal property:

Police Department
Eight-MPH Industries K-55 Radars- Serial numbers, 41916, 41922, 41924, 41926, 41930, 41932, 41936, and 41938

now owned by the Village of Lombard; and said personal property having no resale value; and **WHEREAS**, The Village routinely declares such type of personal property surplus and the best interest of the Village of Lombard will be served by its disposal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

Police Department
Eight-MPH Industries K-55 Radars- Serial numbers, 41916, 41922, 41924, 41926, 41930, 41932, 41936, and 41938

now owned by the Village of Lombard is no longer necessary or useful to the Village of Lombard, that there is no resale value for said personal property in that there is no resale market therefor, and that the best interest of Lombard will be served by donation of said personal property to any interested Illinois Law Enforcement agencies.

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to dispose of the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard in the manner as set forth above.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.




