Washington Blvd. and Fairfield Ave. Stop Sign Installation

The intersection of Washington Boulevard and Fairfield Avenue is currently controlled by a two-way Stop sign on Fairfield Ave. Several accidents have occurred at this intersection, and Committee members stated the need for an all-way control at this location.

During the July 14, 2014 meeting, the Transportation and Safety Committee voted to recommend changing the two-way Stop sign installation to an all-Way Stop sign installation at the Washington Blvd./Fairfield Ave. and to update the Village ordinance at the above intersection.

Ordinance No.

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard have heretofore passed and approved Ordinance 1186, An Ordinance Regulating Traffic in the Village of Lombard (hereinafter the Lombard Traffic Code); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard find that the Lombard Traffic Code has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation and Safety Committee has reviewed the appropriate traffic studies and recommends certain changes to the Lombard Traffic Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard concur in the recommendation of the Transportation and Safety Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: That Schedule IV of the Lombard Traffic Code (Ordinance 1186) entitled STOP STREETS is amended to delete the following hereto:

"Fairfield Avenue shall stop at Washington Boulevard"

Section 2: That Schedule III of the Lombard Traffic Code (Ordinance 1186) entitled STOP INTERSECTIONS is amended to add the following hereto:

"Washington Boulevard and Fairfield Avenue"

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, publication in pamphlet form and the posting of appropriate signs as provided by law.
