Sewer Televising Camera

In 1996, the Department of Public Works purchased a camera to be used for televising sewer services. The camera became one of the most useful tools for the crew to use in locating sewers and troubleshooting problems. In 2000, the Underground Utilities Division purchased another sewer televising camera because the repairs to the original camera had become very costly and the camera was broke more than it was operable. The Water & Sewer Operation and Maintenance Fund includes \$13,000 in the FY 05/06 budget for a new sewer camera in to replace the current one. We are experiencing more down time and increasing repair costs for the current camera system. Each sewer service is televised after the second backup in twelve months (or if conditions warrant it) to accurately locate the service and determine if a Vac-A-Tee clean out is suitable or if it is in need of additional repairs. The existing camera equipment will be used as a backup.

The crew evaluated several camera set ups and determined the Rigid Color Self Leveling Sea Snake with Navatrack receiver and water line locator to be the best equipment to meet their needs. Three quotes were received and they are as follows:
