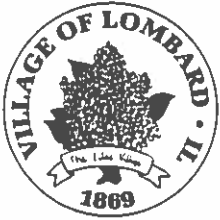

 Subject: FY2016 Vehicle Replacements

There are eight (8) vehicles in the FY2016 budget that are scheduled to be replaced with the Ford Interceptor Utility. Six (6) are replacing squad cars in the Police Department and two (2) are replacing Battalion Chief vehicles in the Fire Department. One additional Battalion Chief vehicle (unit # FR7) will be sold and not replaced at this time. The accumulated reserves to replace unit FR7 will be saved to purchase another Ford Interceptor Utility in the event the Fire Department fills the vacant Battalion Chief position. Since the lead time for the Ford Interceptor is approximately four months staff would like to order all the Interceptors at this time. Below is a summary of the vehicles that staff is requesting to be replaced with Ford Interceptor Utilities;

The Ford Interceptor Utility is available for joint purchase through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC). The current contract winner for the SPC is Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL). The eight (8) Ford Interceptor Utilities with the ready for the road package cost \$238,882. The budgeted amount for this purchase is \$240,000.

I recommend the Board of Trustees award a contract to Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL) in the amount of \$238,882 for eight (8) new Ford Police Interceptor Utilities. I also recommend declaring village unit numbers 725, 726, 739, 740, 741, 742, 5, 6 and 7 as surplus per the attached ordinance and authorize their sale at public auction. Please submit this item to the Village Board for their consideration at the December 3, 2015 meeting.

ORDINANCE _____

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard to sell said personal property at public auction to be held by Obenauf Auction Service. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard, at public auction, by Obenauf Auction Service to the highest bidder on said property. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard.

Section 3: The Village Manager is hereby authorized and may direct Obenauf Auction Service to advertise the sale of the aforementioned personal property in a newspaper published within the community before the date of said public auction.

Section 4: No bid which is less than the minimum price set forth in the list of property to be sold shall be accepted.

Section 5: The Village Manager or his designee shall cause to be transferred any titles or other legal documents pursuant to the sale.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
