WHEREAS, 98 percent of American commuters know sending a text or email while driving is not safe; and

WHEREAS, nearly 50 percent of commuters text while behind the wheel; and

WHEREAS, more than 40 percent of commuters who text while driving reported the activity as being a habit; and

WHEREAS, a Virginia Tech study showed those who send text messages while driving are 23 times more likely to be involved in a traffic accident; and

WHEREAS, a driver that sends a text message while driving not only jeopardizes his or her safety, but also the safety of passengers, pedestrians, and other motorists:
