SUBJECT: Amending Title 11, Chapter 112, Section 112.12(A)

Class "C" Liquor License Category Description

Title 11, Chapter 112, Section 112.12(A) of the Village Code includes a Class "C" liquor license category description, which provides for beer and wine only served as an adjunct to food service, no packaged sales allowed. Currently, there are 8 liquor licenses issued in the Class "C" liquor license category.

In order to apply for a Class "C" liquor license, an applicant's business must be defined as a "Restaurant" or "Self-service restaurant" and does not include "Small restaurant". The definition for a "Restaurant" versus a "Small restaurant" can be found in Title 11, Chapter 112, Section 112.02 of Village Code. A "Restaurant" is defined as having the capacity for serving 75 patrons or more. A "Small restaurant" is defined as having the capacity for serving less than 75 patrons at any combination of tables and booths, as long as the character of the establishment is a restaurant rather than an establishment set up to serve alcoholic beverages as its principal activity.

The way Village Code is currently written, any business defined as a "Small restaurant" would not be eligible for a Class "C" liquor license. In response to inquiries from business owners as well as a review of the current liquor license holders, staff is recommending that the Class "C" liquor license description be amended to include "Small restaurant" whose seating capacity is less than 75 patrons. Staff met with Village Counsel, who drafted the attached ordinance for Village Board consideration.

Please place this item for consideration on the May 17, 2018 Village Board agenda. Staff is requesting a waiver of first reading.

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XI, CHAPTER 112, SECTION 112.12(A) OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE IN REGARD TO THE CLASS "C" LIQUOR LICENSE

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That Title XI, Chapter 112, Section 112.12(A) of the Lombard Village Code is amended by revising the portion thereof relative to the description of the Class "C" liquor license, to read in its entirety as follows:

"Class "C" - Beer and wine only served as an adjunct to food service; no package sales allowed. (Restaurant, Small Restaurant or Self Service Restaurant)"

**SECTION 2:** That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.
