100049; Ordinance to Restrict Parking on Oak Creek Drive, East of Springer Drive

On February 1, 2010, the Transportation and Safety Committee discussed the inability of delivery vehicles to access docking bays located at 960 Springer and 949 Oak Creek Drives because vehicles parked on the adjacent roadway limit large vehicle maneuverability. This area remains to be impacted by extensive on street parking from area businesses with insufficient on-site parking provisions and is negatively impacting commerce for nearby businesses. Several options were discussed, from restricting parking on both sides of Oak Creek Drive at the subject locations to not taking any action.

The Committee voted to recommend an extension of the existing No Parking Zone on the northern side of Oak Creek Drive an additional 255 feet further (totaling 315 feet) east of Springer Drive. This action requires an ordinance to the Traffic Code as follows.
