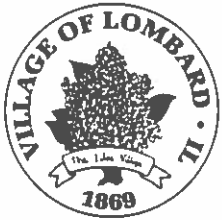

Subject: Vehicle Replacement Due to Accident

On December 6, 2015 a Lombard Police squad car (unit #PP744) was involved in an accident which resulted in enough damage to declare the vehicle a total loss. The Village's insurance administrator, CCMSI, is working with the other party's insurance carrier on a settlement. This settlement should be approximately the value of the car plus expenses incurred swapping the police equipment into a new car. Since the lead time on a new squad car is approximately four months and the Ford 2016 model cutoff date to order is March 11th staff is seeking Board of Trustee approval to order a new car now. The totaled squad car would be stripped and sold to a salvage yard or to the insurance company as part of the settlement. Although the settlement paperwork has not been finalized it is estimated the Village will net approximately \$22,000 for the totaled car. The current amount we have to replace this vehicle in the vehicle reserve fund is \$18,828.

The Ford Interceptor Utility is available for joint purchase through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC). The current contract winner for the SPC is Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL). The Ford Interceptor with the ready for the road package cost \$29,907.

I recommend the Board of Trustees award a contract to Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL) in the amount of \$29,907 for one (1) new Ford Police Interceptor Utility. I also recommend declaring village unit number PP744 as surplus per the attached ordinance and authorize its sale. Please submit this item to the Village Board for their consideration at the February 18, 2016 meeting.

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND/OR DISPOSAL
OF MUNICIPAL OWNED PERSONAL PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain the following described personal property:
