Kay Yow was a former North Carolina State University women's basketball coach who lost her battle with breast cancer last January. The Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund was established to raise funds for cancer research.

"I am amazed that one eighth grade player with an idea could have this event turn into what it did. Olivia Domin did a great job," stated Eric Willis, who not only teaches at Jackson but also helped organize the event. "These are the types of things those girls will remember for the rest of their lives.

"The girls' 7th and 8th grade basketball games united the school involving students, teachers, administrators and the community," said April Domin. "The Jackson Middle School 7th and 8th grade girl's basketball teams have sent the message, and have led by example, that we can all reach out and support the fight against breast cancer."

During her remarks at the basketball game, 8th grader, Olivia Domin concluded by saying, "I have no doubt Coach Yow's spirit will be with us on the court today."
