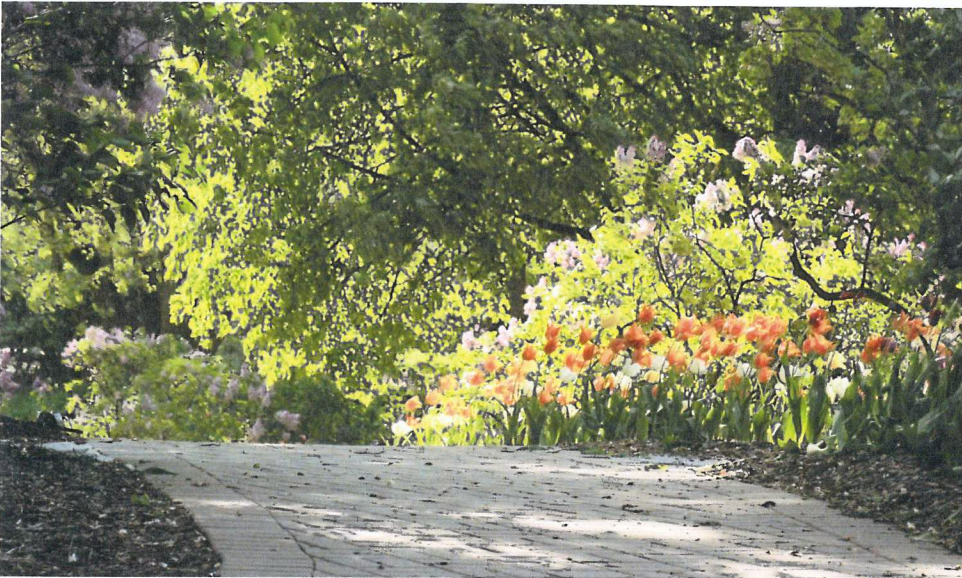

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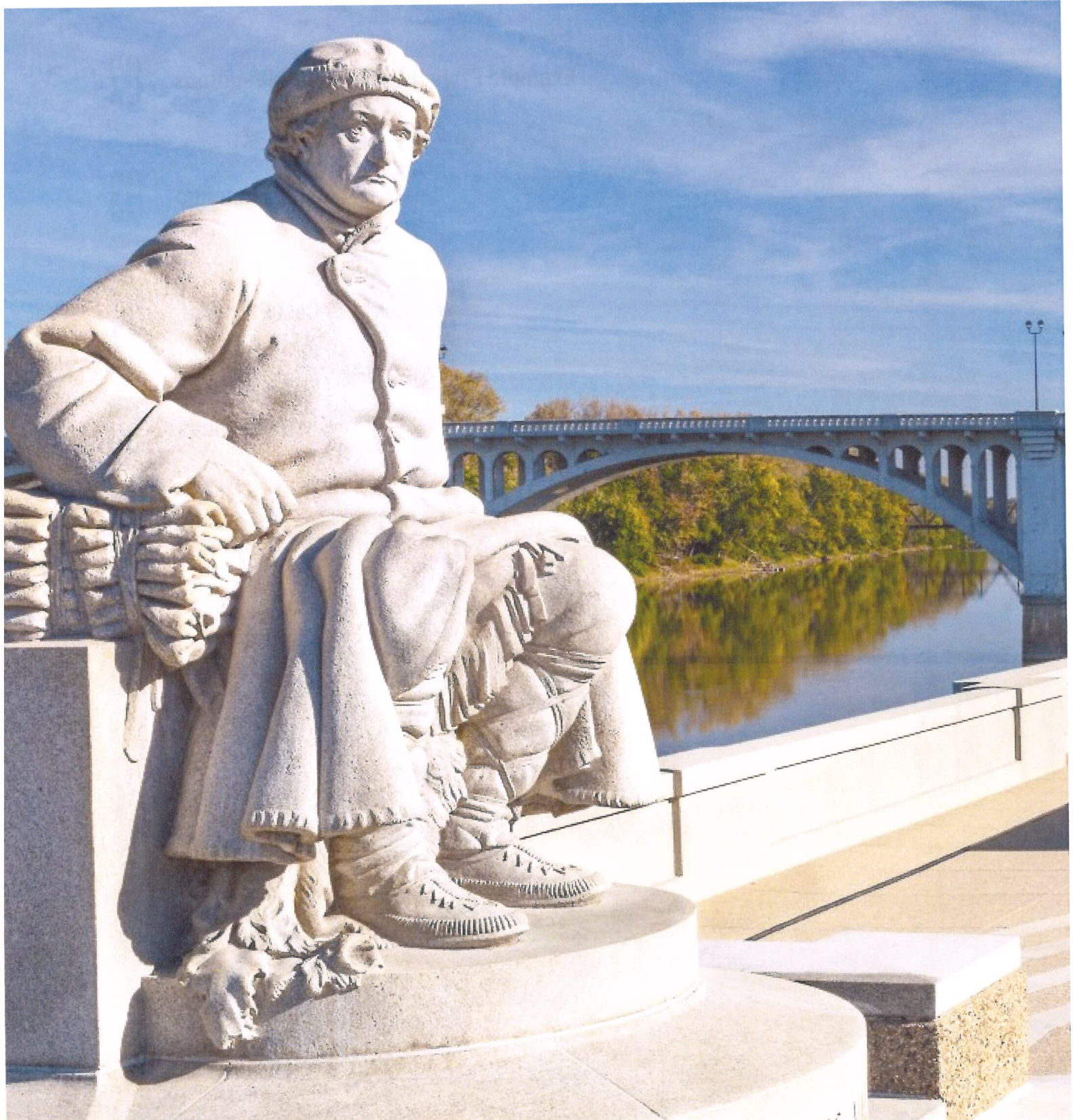

RATIO is pleased to submit our qualifications to complete the National Register of Historic Places nomination for Lombard's Lilacia Park. As we understand, the Village of Lombard - through the efforts of the Lombard Historic Preservation Commission and the Lombard Historical Society - has secured a \$13,500 grant from the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office to complete the study. We congratulate you on securing this grant and hope to be able to work with the Village to complete the nomination.

RATIO was founded in 1982 as a firm specializing in Historic Preservation and has since grown into a multi-disciplinary firm offering architecture, historic preservation, interior design, landscape architecture, urban design and planning, economic development, and graphic design.

Our historic preservation studio consists of six trained historic preservation professionals with expertise in the documentation and preservation planning of historic properties. Beech Church & Beech Cemetery in Carthage, Indiana; the Blanton House in Danville, Indiana; and the South Side Turnverein Hall in Indianapolis, Indiana. In addition, we have completed dozens of historic property assessments, Historic Structure Reports (HSR), feasibility studies, and maintenance and treatment plans.

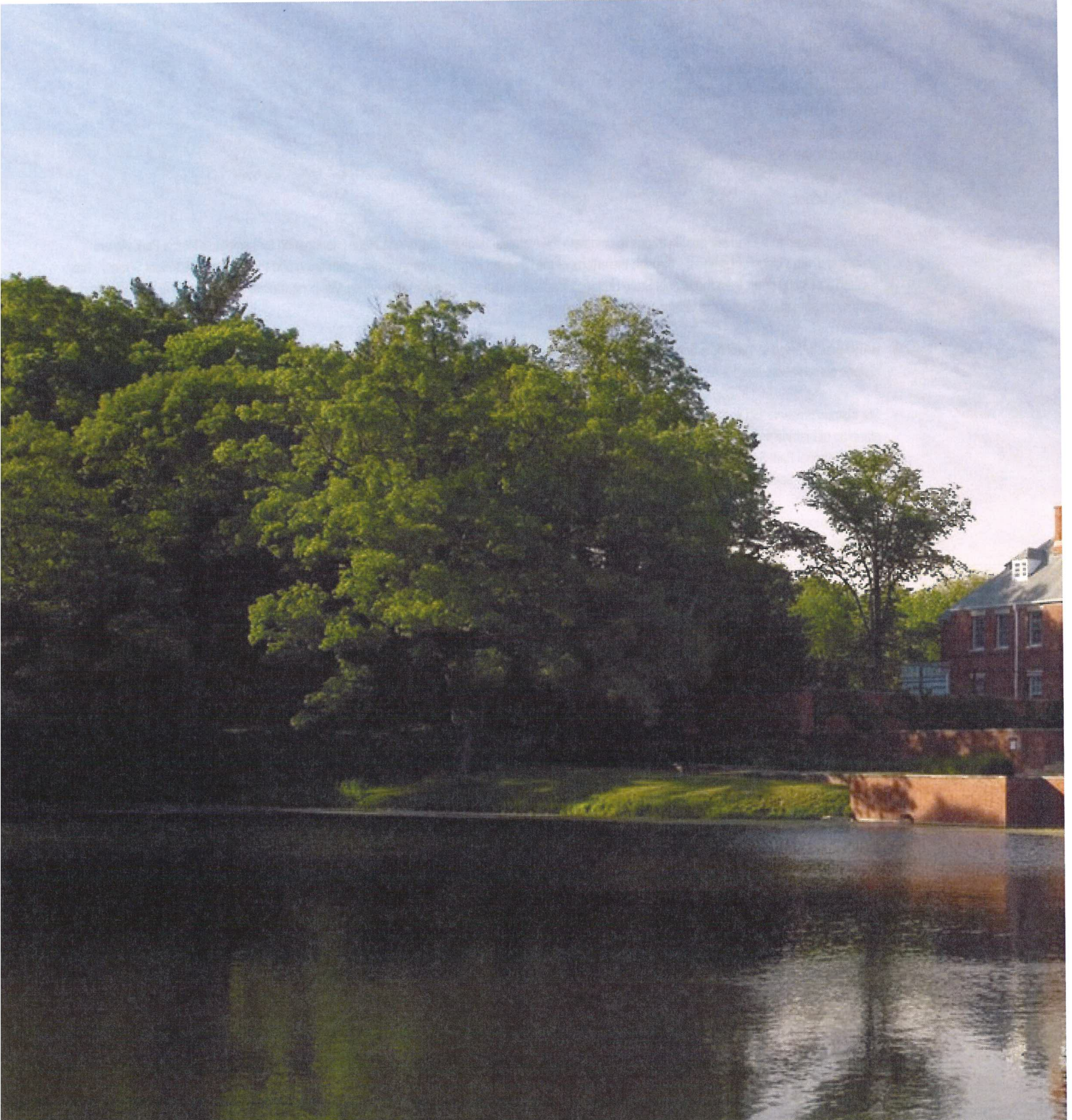

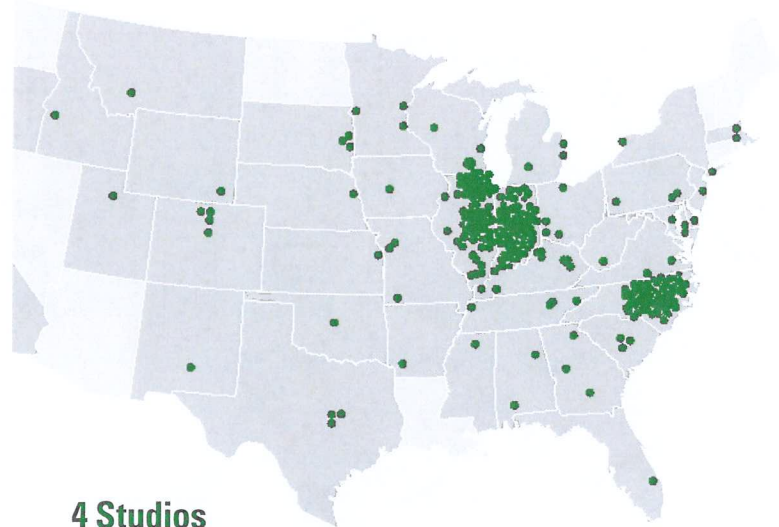

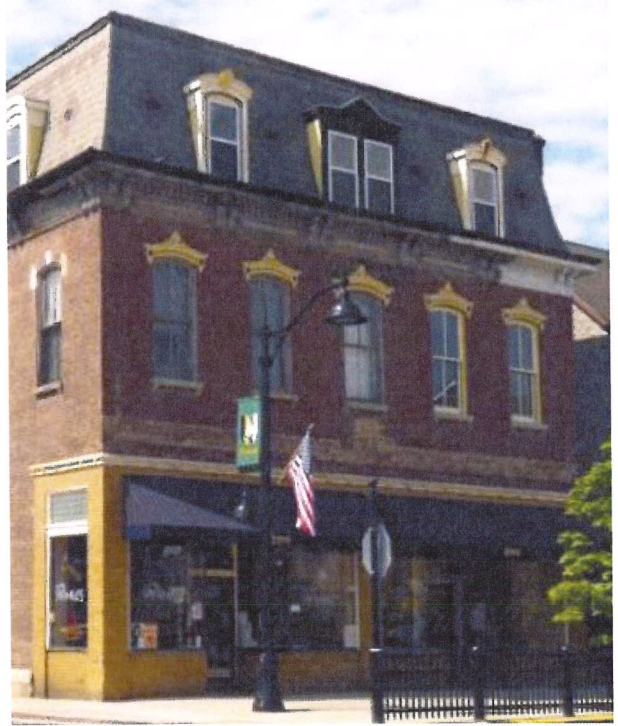

Belleville Historic District Documentation

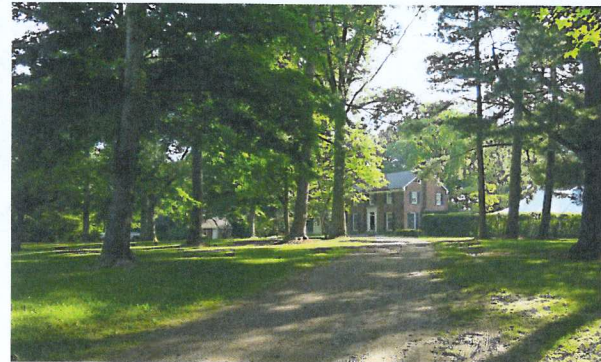
City of Belleville | Belleville, IL

The City of Belleville selected RATIO to provide historic preservation consultation services on the documentation of historic resources in two proposed historic districts along W. Main Street in Belleville. RATIO compiled and analyzed existing surveys, prepared maps of the proposed district boundaries, identified contributing and non-contributing resources, and prepared narratives on National Register eligibility and boundary justification for each district. These documents were provided to the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, facilitating a determination of eligibility for the two proposed districts.

The proposed West Belleville Historic District contains 723 resources. The Blair Historic District, encompassing the western part of downtown Belleville, contains 78 resources and was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 2015.

Blanton House

Town of Danville | Danville, IN

The Town of Danville selected RATIO to prepare a National Register of Historic Places nomination for the Blanton House, a semi-rural estate developed on the northern outskirts of Danville, Indiana, in 1935. Set on seventy-three acres, the site contains a Colonial Revival style house and outbuildings, designed by Indianapolis architects Burns & James.

The property embodies distinctive characteristics of Period Revival suburban estates designed between World War I and World War II and represents the work of design professionals influential in residential construction for central Indiana during this period.

Acquired by the town in 2000, the house and designed landscape are significant of the inter-war Colonial Revival ideal, a modern suburban property carefully designed to give the impression of a Colonial homestead that had developed over generations.

Ohio Falls Car & Locomotive Company

Indiana Department of Transportation | Jeffersonville, IN

RATIO was selected to prepare a National Register of Historic Places nomination for the Ohio Falls Car & Locomotive Company, built in 1872-1873 just above the Ohio River falls opposite Louisville, Kentucky. The complex, built with non-combustible materials to reduce the risk of fire, housed the manufacture of freight and passenger railroad cars, electric streetcars, and related components. In 1899, Ohio Falls merged with 12 other companies to form the American Car & Foundry Company, which operated the plant until 1930. The plant produced products for the U.S. Army during World War I and World War II.

Although some resources were lost after the plant's closure and others were damaged from the Ohio River flooding, the complex retains a high degree of integrity. The district includes 19 buildings and two structures, now known as the Water Tower Square Business Park. The district was nominated as mitigation for the Louisville – Southern Indiana Ohio River Bridges Project and was determined eligible for listing in the National Register by the National Park Service but was not listed due to owner objection.

Plainfield Historic District

Town of Plainfield | Plainfield, IN

The Plainfield Historic District contains 279 resources and comprises the historic commercial and residential core of Plainfield, Indiana. The district is representative of many small Midwestern towns which developed between 1831 and 1959. The RATIO team conducted a survey of the district, performed historical research, established district boundaries, prepared the nomination to the National Register of Historic Places, and participated in public meetings related to the nomination process.

Central Batesville Historic District

Indiana Landmarks | Batesville, IN

Indiana Landmarks selected RATIO to nominate the Central Batesville Historic District to the National Register of Historic Places. The district encompasses the historic commercial and industrial core of Batesville and contains 65 resources over 16 blocks. The period of significance spans 1852 to 1960, reflecting the period of development within the district and the growth of furniture and casket manufacturing in the community. The district's listing facilitated the tax credit redevelopment of several historic factory buildings, revitalizing Batesville's downtown area.

Jasper Downtown Historic District

City of Jasper | Jasper, IN

The Jasper Downtown Historic District is a notable collection of commercial and governmental buildings focused around a Lancaster Square with the Dubois County Courthouse in the center. Platted in 1830, Jasper became the seat of Dubois County in 1831. A large wave of German-speaking refugees settled in the area following the failed revolutions of 1848 and these settlers and their descendants built many of the buildings in the district. Jasper retains a strong sense of its German ethnic heritage and the district's architecture reflects the German-Americans' embrace of American architectural forms and styles while preserving their native language and culture.

RATIO's preservation team worked with the City of Jasper to complete a national register nomination for the property. The district contains 51 contributing resources that retain a high level of historic integrity to the period 1878-1952. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Jasper Downtown Historic District is locally significant as the historic center of Dubois County's commercial and governmental activity and as the county's largest and best collection of late-nineteenth and early-twentieth-century commercial architecture. The district's history and development are associated with national trends in immigration and the maintenance of ethnic heritage and cultural identity in Indiana.

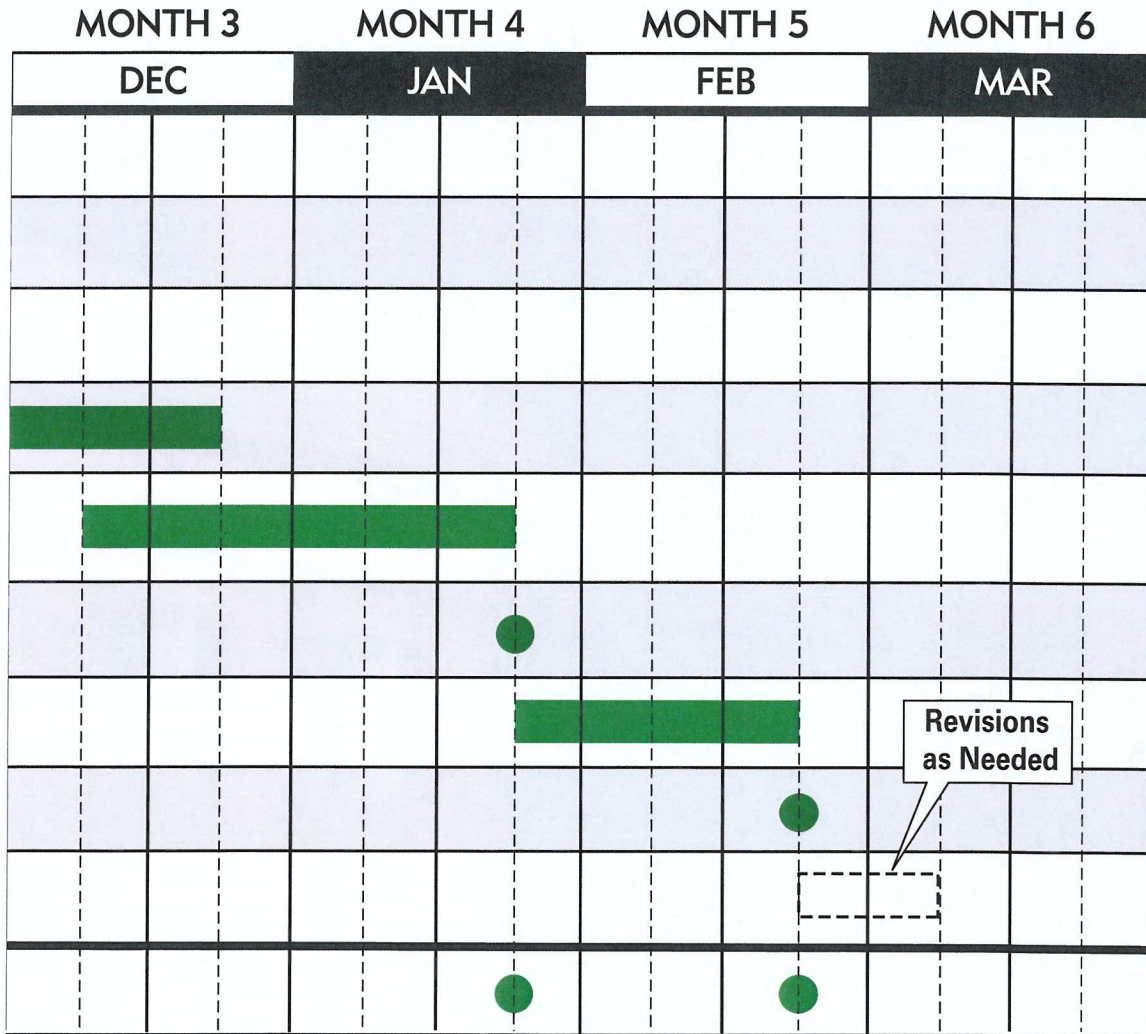
PROJECT TIMELINE

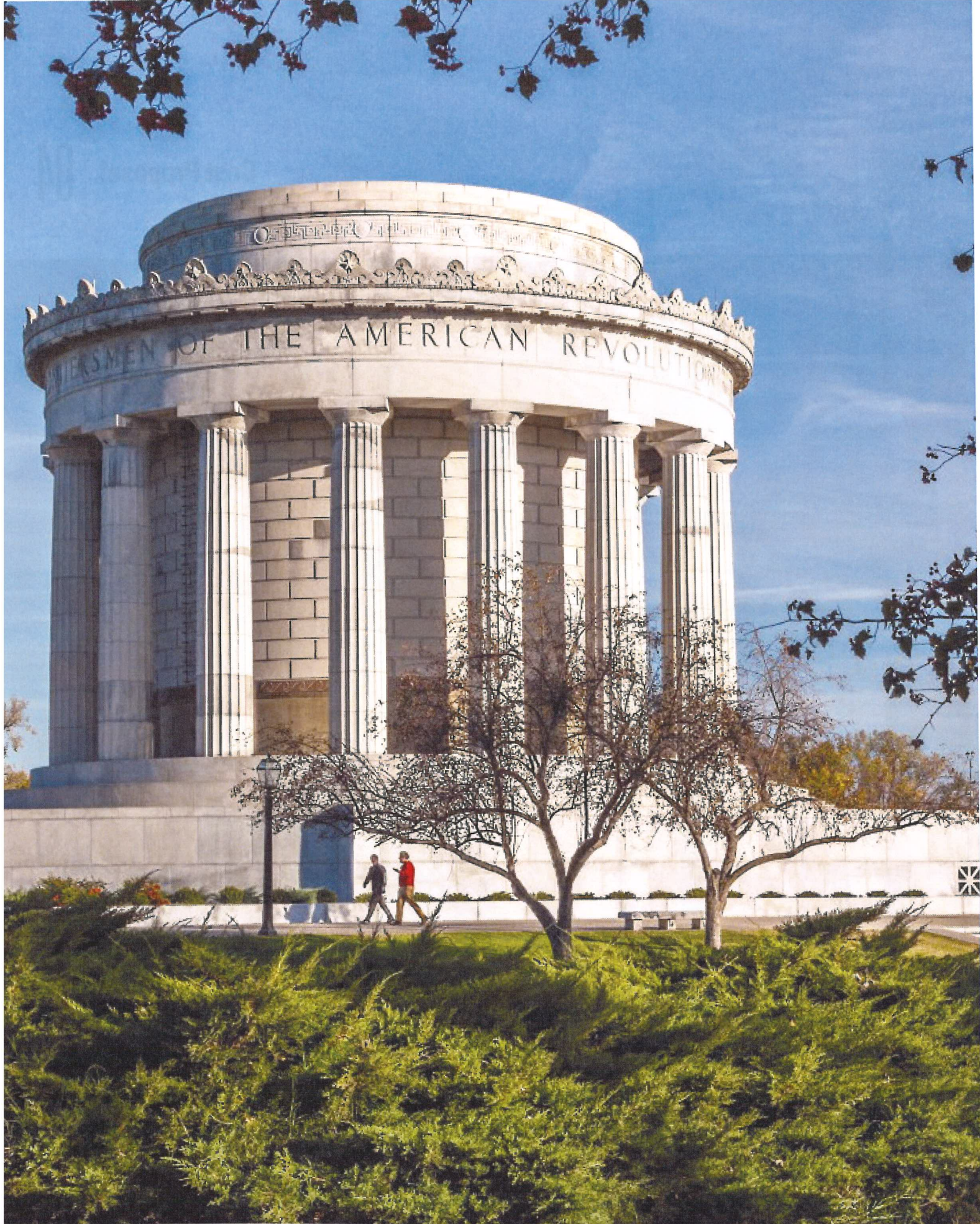

LANIER MANSION STATE HISTORIC SITE







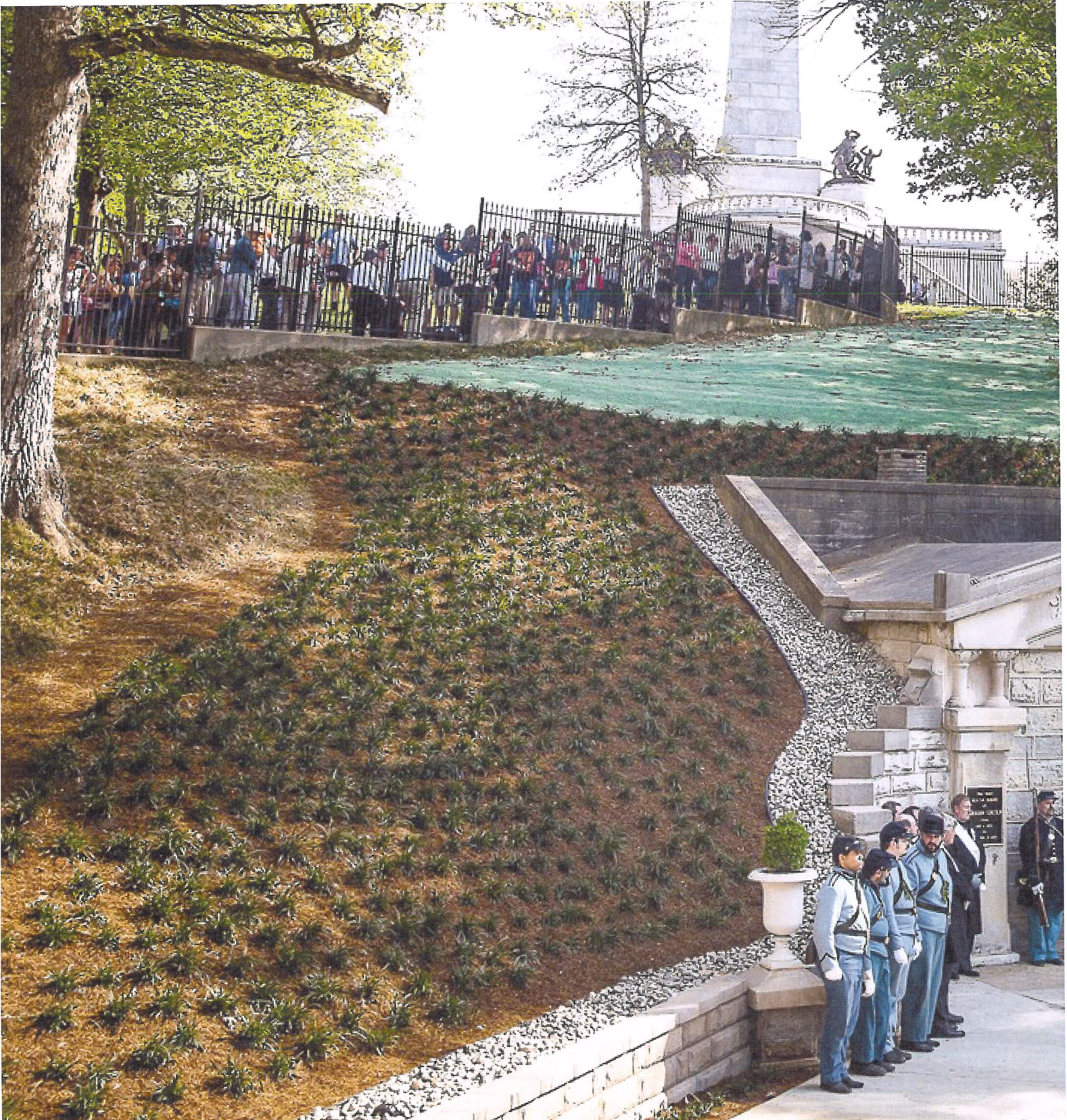
