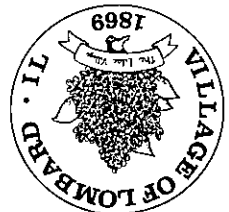



Subject: Disposal Outdated Radar/Laser Units

The police department regularly updates our traffic Radar/Laser units by purchasing new units each year through the State of Illinois purchase contract. As these older units are replaced we have been keeping them as spare units. We have now accumulated six outdated radar units and one laser that no longer meet our needs with some units no longer functioning.

These units have a nominal value and trading the units in on future purchases is not possible due to the State purchasing contract that offers exceptional pricing with no trade in. Rather than discard the units, we typically offer these units to less fortunate police agencies that may be interested in the units.

I respectfully request that these radar/laser units be declared surplus by the Village Board and donated to any Illinois Law Enforcement agency(s) that may be interested. Attached is a draft ordinance that lists of the seven radar and one laser units and their serial numbers. We are requesting waiver of first reading to expedite the disposal.

ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND/OR DISPOSAL
OF MUNICIPAL OWNED PERSONAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the majority of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain the following described personal property:

Police Department
Five-MPH Industries Python Radars- Serial numbers, PYT380001341, PYT380001342, PYT380001344, PYT546002946, PYT546003514. One Kustom Signal Talon Radar- Serial number T3831. One-Laser Technology Marksman Laser Serial number 7914.

now owned by the Village of Lombard; and said personal property having no resale value; and WHEREAS, The Village routinely declares such type of personal property surplus and the best interest of the Village of Lombard will be served by its disposal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS,

as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

now owned by the Village of Lombard is no longer necessary or useful to the Village of Lombard, that there is no resale value for said personal property in that there is no resale market therefor, and that the best interest of Lombard will be served by donation of said personal property to any interested Illinois Law Enforcement agencies.

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to dispose of the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard in the manner as set forth above.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
