ORDINANCE 7131

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard to sell said vehicle and technology items at public auction to be held Obenauf Auction Service. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard. Police equipment will be sold or donated to any department seeing purchase or donated to CERT programs, Citizen Police Academy, or Explorer units. Some radios may be sold on govedeals.com or the police departments recovered property auction site.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

11 Motorola Radios model HT 1250, 14 Motorola Radios model MT 1000, 75 Motorola Radios model HT 1000, 9 Motorola Radios model SABRE, 15 Vertex Standard radios, 1 Motorola radio model JT 1000, and 9 Motorola wall mount charging stations for HT 1000 radios. Each radio will have an accompanying battery, cord, and charger.

now owned by the Village of Lombard are no longer necessary or useful to the Village of Lombard and the best interests of the Village of Lombard will be served by its sale or donated.

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sell or donate the aforementioned vehicle, technology items, radios now owned by the Village of Lombard. The vehicle and technology items at public auction, by Obenauf Auction Service to the highest bidder on said property. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard. Police radios will be sold or donated to any department seeing purchase or donated to CERT programs, Citizen Police Academy, or Explorer units. Some radios may be sold on govedeals.com or the police departments recovered property auction site.

Section 3: The Village Manager is hereby authorized and may direct Obenauf Auction Service to advertise the sale of the aforementioned vehicle in a newspaper published within the community before the date of said public auction.

Section 4: No bid which is less than the minimum price set forth in the list of property to be sold shall be accepted.

Section 5: The Village Manager or his designee shall cause to be transferred any titles or other legal documents pursuant to the sale.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
