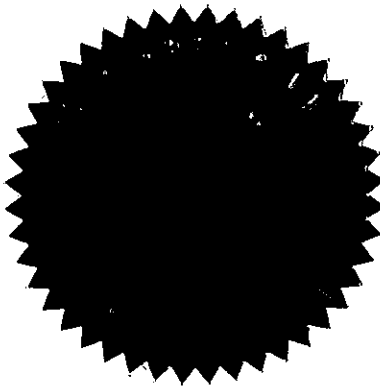

ORDINANCE 4983

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3, CHAPTERS 32 AND 34 OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE IN REGARD TO THE POSITION OF DEPUTY CHIEF OF POLICE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Act 91-615, effective August 19, 1999, 65 ILCS 5/10-

2.1-4 was amended to allow non-home rule municipalities of 130,000 or fewer inhabitants to, by ordinance, allow the Chief of Police, rather than the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners, to

appoint the Deputy Chief(s) of Police; and

WHEREAS, there currently are no vacancies in the rank of Deputy Chief of Police within the Lombard Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees deem it to be in the best interest of the

Village to amend the Village Code to provide for the appointment of all future Deputy Chiefs of Police by the Chief of Police, rather than the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the President and Board of Trustees of the

Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Title 3, Chapter 32, Section 32.043 of the Lombard Village Code is

amended by revising the last sentence thereof to read in its entirety as follows:

"This Section shall only apply to full-time firefighters and police officers other than the Chief of Police, Deputy Chief(s) of Police and the Fire Chief."

SECTION 2: That Title 3, Chapter 34, Section 34.02 of the Lombard Village Code is

amended to read in its entirety as follows:

"§34.02 RANKS CREATED.

The various offices and ranks listed below are hereby created, with appointments to fill any vacancies in said ranks, as certified in writing by the Village Manager, to take place as set forth below:

- (A) Deputy Chief: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/10-2.1-4, the Deputy Chief position shall be an exempt rank immediately below that of Chief of Police. The Chief of Police shall appoint

the Deputy Chief(s) from any rank of sworn, full-time officers of the Village's Police Department. The individual(s) selected to fill the Deputy Chief position shall have at least five (5) years of full-time service as a Police Officer with the Village's Police Department. The Deputy Chief(s) shall serve at the discretion of the Chief of Police and, if removed from the position of Deputy Chief by the Chief of Police, shall revert to the rank held immediately prior to appointment to the Deputy Chief position. There shall be no more than two (2) Deputy Chief positions within the Police Department.

(B) Lieutenant: Appointed by the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners upon certification of a vacancy by the Village Manager pursuant to Section 34.03 below.

(C) Sergeant: Appointed by the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners upon certification of a vacancy by the Village Manager pursuant to Section 34.03 below.

(D) Police Officer: Appointed by the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners upon certification of a vacancy by the Village Manager pursuant to Section 34.03 below.

The number authorized to serve in each rank shall be as determined annually in the Budget Ordinance adopted by the Village.

SECTION 3: That Title 3, Chapter 34, Section 34.03 of the Lombard Village Code is

amended as follows:

- A. The first sentence thereof is amended to read in its entirety as follows:
 "Except as provided in subsection 34.02(A) above, the number of vacancies in each rank, as set forth in Section 34.02 above, shall only be filled upon written certification of the Village Manager to the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners."
- B. The second sentence thereof is amended by deleting the words, "grade or," therefrom.

SECTION 4: That Title 3, Chapter 34, Section 34.24 of the Lombard Village Code is

amended by revising the reference therein to, "Except for the Police Chief," to read, "Except for the Police Chief and the Deputy Chief(s) of Police".

SECTION 5: That the two (2) individuals currently serving as Deputy Chiefs of Police, as

of the effective date of this Ordinance, shall remain in said rank, with any vacancies in said rank of Deputy Chief of Police occurring after the effective date of this Ordinance being filled in

accordance with the terms hereof.

SECTION 6: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its

passage and approval as provided by law.




