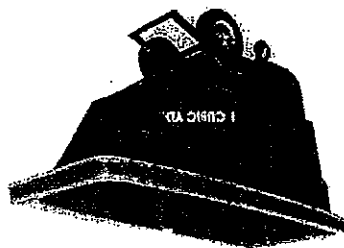

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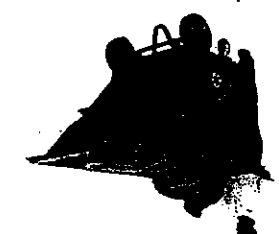

**Part 2d:**

Provide a clear, concise description of the proposed project:

We are eager expand our school's recycling efforts to include paper, plastic and aluminum. This grant will allow us to operationalize a full-spectrum recycling program for the nearly 3000 students and staff that learn and work at Glenbard East each day. The school district is willing to pay for the additional recycling dumpsters required to expand our current program to include more than just cardboard and paper at an annual cost of \$9,000 for a once a week pickup or \$18,000 for a twice a week pickup. With this grant we will purchase a large rolling dump cart for each wing of the school which will be used by student volunteers each week to collect recycling material for each classroom and office and then transport the collected materials to the recycling dumpsters outside. Most of our students and staff are active recyclers at home and they are excited about the opportunity to expand their recycling efforts while at school.

**Part 3f:**

Explain your current recycling/environmental/conservation program and past accomplishments:

We have school-wide paper and cardboard recycling in the past, but currently are recycling only cardboard. If this grant proposal is funded the school will fund increased costs for additional recycling dumpsters to collect plastic, and aluminum in addition to paper and cardboard.

What does your institution do for the environment other than recycling?

The school has been very proactive to reduce the amount of energy used to operate the school. Motion sensors have been installed in every classroom and bathroom, which automatically turn the lights on and off. Compact fluorescent light bulbs have been installed all closets, storage rooms, and mechanical rooms. Variable drives have been

on all ventilation fan motors. Hallway lighting and all HVAC systems are computer controlled and programmed to only operate when the building is occupied. Computers are shut down at the end of each school day. The school has also purchased outdoor benches made of recycled plastic material. All the trees and plants on campus have been surrounded by recycled wood mulch.

With past help from the Environmental Concerns Committee we have also been developing and improving our native prairie on the school grounds. In addition to conserving water, this natural prairie area reduces the need for mowing on the school grounds.

### How has the program helped people in the Village of Lombard?

Students are involved in local conservation efforts in several ways:

1. Providing student volunteers / help for the Lombard Recycling Extravaganza Preserve's Citizen Stream Monitoring program
2. Conducting annual surveys of the Dupage River as part of the Dupage Forest Preserve's Citizen Stream Monitoring program
3. Providing student help and information at the Prairie Days at Terrace View Park
4. Participating in restoration workdays in local forest preserves

We are eager expand our school's recycling efforts to include paper, plastic and aluminum.

The science kits that have been chosen are based on studying some of the problems in the environment around us. These kits allow students to examine such factors as air pollution and pond quality. Using these kits within the environmental science classes will help the students to make connections with their environment using real data.

The purchases from Ward's Natural Science Company are designed to test and compare the air quality in a large number of areas. Among the test factors are ammonia, chlorine, lead, nitrogen dioxide, sulfur dioxide, and total oxidants. The air monitoring is enhanced with this manually operated pump. The pump comes with an impinger and delivers 50 ml of air per stroke. This will enable students to obtain data from local areas such as the industrial complex along the expressway to the forest preserves; North of the City of Chicago to Downtown and South of the city.

The second set of kits is designed to show life in a pond but will also show the effects of man made changes to pond life on a microscopic scale. This will utilize both the stereo microscopes and the video flex camera. These items were gratefully obtained from past grants. After the miniponds are established, a control will be maintained. Man made changes in the environment such as salt added to the roads in winter, chlorine entering the ecosystem in purifying water, and other exchanges can be observed.

The students at Montini are taking a class in environmental science because we want them to learn about our environmental issues that their own parents or even the average person may not be aware of. It was not that long ago when people would throw trash out of their car windows, or dump antifreeze oil in a toilet or storm drain. Industrial companies would put toxic waste into the ground. Many of these people may have simply been ignorant of how much of an impact every person has on our environment. It would not be surprising to learn that many people believe that what they do as an individual can do no harm.
