

- **WHEREAS,** Metra is asking communities to participate in their Back-to-School Safety Campaign urging children to be safe, be smart and to stay off the tracks; and
- **WHEREAS,** Metra works closely with operation Lifesaver, a public education program designed to increase awareness; and
- **WHEREAS,** Metra focuses on the three E's plan education, the key to increasing safety awareness; engineering, a crucial element in keeping roads safe; and enforcement, the final effort to reaffirm the importance of safe behavior near tracks; and
- WHEREAS, Metra asks that families be aware of the following safety tips and share this with their children: Never take a shortcut across tracks; Look both ways before crossing tracks at outlying train stations and grade crossings even if the warning devices are not activated; If warning devices activate as you approach a crossing, do not rush across the tracks; Stand at a safe distance from the tracks when warning devices are activated, as trains my extend three feet or more outside the rails; Do not cross the tracks immediately after a train passes, as another train may be approaching on adjacent tracks; Wait until there is a clear view in both directions; Remember there is a gap between the tracks and crosswalk areas. Avoid stepping on them and walk bikes across tracks; Freight trains do not travel on predictable schedules and schedules for passenger trains can change; Never walk down train tracks. It is illegal and dangerous; Trains can be very quiet. Do not get caught off guard as trains can not stop quickly; Look, listen and live!
