BACKGROUND/POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

Elizabeth Street Parking Restriction

Narrowed pavement in the Lombard Meadows subdivision provided several operational benefits, but due to the decreased pavement area, the Public Safety and Transportation Committee voted to provide parking restrictions on Lilac Way, Lodge Lane, and Chase Lane at the locations stated in the memo. The Committee requests the parking restriction and to update the Village ordinance at the above locations.

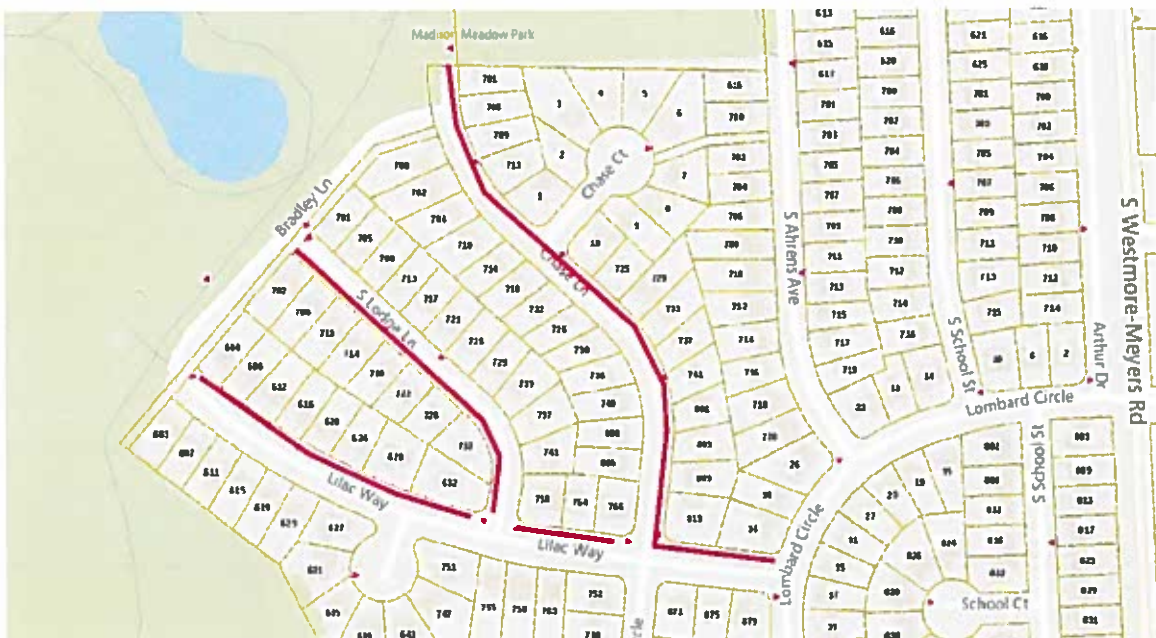

Lomabrd Meadows Subdivision Parking Restriction

As part of the Capital Improvement Plan, the Lombard Meadows subdivision is being reconstructed to address issues with existing infrastructure. The project is broken into five phases. The first phase, which included Chase Lane and Chase Court, was completed in 2014, and the second phase for 2015 includes Lodge Lane, Lilac Way, and Bradley Lane. Subsequent construction phases are anticipated in 2019, 2021, and 2022.

Part of the project includes reducing the roadway width on Lilac Way. Narrowing the pavement will make snow operations more efficient, reduce future maintenance costs and stormwater runoff, enhance neighborhood aesthetics, and calm traffic. With the narrowed roadway, a one side only parking restriction is proposed on the hydrant side of the street (north side for all streets except Lodge Lane). The restriction will enhance emergency vehicle response and improve traffic flow during events at Madison Meadows Park. This action has been discussed with the Lombard Park District and the Lombard Falcons, and it is supported by the Police and Fire Departments. The Public Safety and Transportation Committee has voted to recommend this item for Board approval.

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard have heretofore passed and approved Ordinance 1186, An Ordinance Regulating Traffic in the Village of Lombard (hereinafter the Lombard Traffic Code); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard find that the Lombard Traffic Code has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Public Safety and Transportation Committee has reviewed the appropriate traffic studies and recommends certain changes to the Lombard Traffic Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard concur in the recommendation of the Public Safety and Transportation Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: That Schedule VII of the Lombard Traffic Code (Ordinance 1186) is amended to add the following restrictions:

“Chase Lane, north side, from Lilac Way to Bradley Lane”

“Lodge Lane, south side, from Lilac Way to Bradley Lane”

Section 2: That Schedule VII of the Lombard Traffic Code (Ordinance 1186) is amended to revise the following restriction:

“Lilac Way, north side, from West property line of 604 Lilac Way to A Point 50 feet east” to “Lilac Way, north side, from West property line of 604 Lilac Way to Lombard Circle”

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, publication in pamphlet form and the posting of appropriate signs as provided by law.
