120054; Ordinance to Add Parking Restrictions on Ridge Avenue

The business owners at 901 and 905 Ridge Avenue have consistently complained of tractor-trailer vehicles being parked and stored on the east side of Ridge Avenue in such a manner that causes inaccessibility of actuated vehicles to the businesses and creating visual constraints to vehicles exiting the property. Lombard Police have responded numerous times to discuss the recurring situation with the area businesses on both east and west sides of Ridge Avenue without being able to mitigate the concerns. A petition from the local businesses has been submitted requesting parking restrictions for the east side of Ridge Avenue (see attached). Lombard Police Officer Joe Menolascino has reiterated similar observations to the Public Works Department and recommends some regulatory action be taken. On January 25, 2012, authorization for the temporary placement for a No Parking Zone was enacted by the Chief of Police and Director of Public Works for this property and the north and south adjacent properties. A map of the existing and proposed No Parking regulation is attached for your review, along with a copy of the temporary authorization.

On February 6, 2012, the Transportation and Safety Committee voted to recommend the following modifications to the Traffic Code.

SCHEDULE VII – PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES ON CERTAIN STREETS

In accordance with Section 10-13-6 and when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall, at any time, park a vehicle upon any of the following streets or parts of streets:

for NO PARKING Sign in front of 905 N. Ridge Ave (East Side of Street) Lombard. IL.

PURPOSE:

To get the Village of Lombard to put "NO PARKING" signs up in front of 901/905 Ridge Ave to effectively discourage long-term and overnight parking by a local trucking company. Short-term parking by trucks with hazard blinkers on during staging/loading/unloading would be unaffected and will not be ticketed by Lombard Police Department.

ISSUES:

- 1. <u>SAFETY</u>: Drivers leaving the 901/905 building have to pull far into Ridge Ave to see around the long semi truck and trailer. This could lead to a collision with traffic, often large trucks, travelling at 30+mpg on Ridge. The same goes for drivers entering 901/905, as the view is compromised by the long truck.
- 2. <u>BUSINESS OPERATIONS</u>: Business owners in the 901/905 building need truck drivers to access their driveways and parking lots to load/unload goods. The trucks parked on Ridge Ave in front of 901/905 make it difficult for even professional semi-truck drivers to back their trucks into the lot. This complaint is heard weekly.
- 3. <u>FAIR USE OF THE STREET</u>: Business owners use that area to stage deliveries and pickups of goods. Trucks drivers wishing to deliver to a 901/905 Ridge business owner must park far away, sometimes up to 200 yards down the street due to parked trucks, before receiving instructions and attempting to pull in.

We, the undersigned, wish to petition the Village of Lombard for a NO PARKING zone in front of 901/905 N. Ridge Ave, Lombard, IL 60148.

AUTHORIZATION FOR TEMPORARY OR EMERGENCY PLACEMENT OF TRAFFIC CONTROL REGULATION OR DEVICE

Pursuant to the Village of Lombard Traffic Code, section 10-3-8, the below listed temporary or experimental regulation is authorized as an emergency or special condition: (please specify)

The owner of the business at 905 Ridge Avenue has consistently complained of actuated vehicle tractors and trailers being parked and stored on the east side of Ridge Avenue in such a manner that causes inaccessibility of actuated vehicles to his business and creates visual constraints to vehicles exiting the property. Lombard Police have responded numerous times to discuss the recurring situation with the business responsible for apparently parking both legally and illegally on both east and west sides of Ridge Avenue without being able to mitigate the concerns. The complainant is circulating a petition requesting parking restrictions for the east side of Ridge Avenue. Lombard Officer Joe Menolascino has reiterated similar observations to the Public Works Department and recommends some regulatory action be taken. Therefore, as a trial and temporary measure to mitigate interruptions to commerce and to maintain a clear line-of-sight distance at the rightof-way until the issue can be discussed by the Transportation and Safety Committee, parking shall be prohibited on the east side of Ridge Avenue between the south property line of 833 Ridge Avenue to the north property line of 931 Ridge Avenue (see attached map).

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE LOMBARD TRAFFIC CODE

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard have heretofore passed and approved Ordinance 1186, An Ordinance Regulating Traffic in the Village of Lombard (hereinafter the Lombard Traffic Code); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard find that the Lombard Traffic Code has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation and Safety Committee has reviewed the appropriate traffic studies and recommends certain changes to the Lombard Traffic Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard concur in the recommendation of the Transportation and Safety Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> That Schedule VII of the Lombard Traffic Code (Ordinance 1186) entitled PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES ON CERTAIN STREETS be amended to add the following thereto:
