Subject: Parking on Berkshire between Main and Charlotte

Mr. Marty Plinski, Community Service Officer, Police Department, requested the "No Parking" signage be moved from the south side of Berkshire to the north side. There is a conflict with pedestrians and vehicles during baseball games held at this location. Children have to cross the street to get to the ball field. Berkshire in this area is an unimproved street and is narrow.

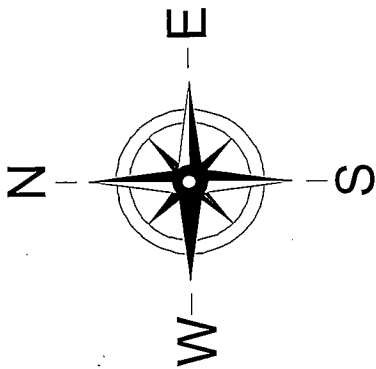
The south side of Berkshire is posted "No Parking" from Main St. to 285 feet east (see attached drawing). In August of 1997, the Street Division paved the shoulder on the south side of Berkshire and it is used for a drop-off/pick-up area for school children.

I met with Mr. Roy Kauzlarich, Principal, of Pleasant Lane School to review their school "Preferred School Route Plan". Mr. Kauzlarich agreed that moving the permanent "No Parking" to the north side of Berkshire would be safer. To better address the needs of the school, Mr. Kauzlarich requested the south side of Berkshire be posted "No Parking, School Days, 8 am - 4 pm".

I would recommend installing signage as outlined on the drawing.
