SUBJECT: Commercial Recyclers Licenses – Amendment to Increase Quantity

DATE: October 28, 2019

Attached is a proposed ordinance to amend the Village Code to increase the quantity of Commercial Recycler licenses from three to five.

BACKGROUND:

Village Code Section 124 (A) currently limits the number of Commercial Recyclers licenses at three. These licenses allow the collection of atypical recyclables that are not the purview of the Village's contracted solid waste company, Waste Management. Per the Solid Waste Contract, "Atypical Recyclables" include, but are not limited to, baled cardboard, scrap metal, clean construction and demolition debris (CCDD), wood and electronics.

This ordinance to amend the Village Code is requested to accommodate license requests from two additional firms, SBC Waste Solutions and Redline Metals. Other firms currently holding licenses are Flood Brother Disposal Company, Molenhouse Enterprises, and Lakeshore Recycling Systems.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board of Trustees approve the ordinance. A waiver of first reading is requested in order to allow the additional licenses to be issued immediately.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 11, CHAPTER 124, SECTION 124.04 (A) OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE IN REGARD TO COMMERCIAL RECYCLERS LICENSES

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That, effective November 7, 2019, Title 11, Chapter 124, Section 124 (A) of the Lombard Village Code is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

“Number limited. The Village Clerk shall not issue more than five (5) Commercial Recycler Licenses.”

This increase from three (3) to five (5) licenses reflects the issuance of the issuance of Commercial Recycler licenses to SBC Waste Solutions Inc and Redline Metals.

SECTION 2: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on from and after its adoption, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
