




# **Redistricting Overview**

WHAT IS REDISTRICTING?

- Process of redrawing boundaries of voting districts based on population changes
- Occurs every 10 years following the U.S Census and governed by State law
- State law requires no more than a 10% deviation in population from one district to another
- Helps ensure residents have fair and equal representation on the Village Board
- Impacts only Village of Lombard Trustee districts, boundaries, and maps (no impact to school, park or other district boundary lines)





#### 2020 Census

#### WHAT WAS THE IMPACT OF THE CENSUS?

- Total population increased by 1,281 persons to 44,476
- Substantial population growth in District 3 due to new developments
- Ideal district size is 7,413 residents (44,476/6)
- To meet the 10% threshold, no two districts may have a difference of more than 741 persons in total population
- District 3 would exceed the 10% maximum allowable district deviation
- Village is now required to create new district boundaries to distribute population more evenly



| District 5   | 6,978      | 15.7%      | -0.98%                  |

## **Lombard Redistricting**

WHAT STEPS HAS THE BOARD TAKEN?

- Village Board workshop December 2, 2021
- Village staff proposed four map options for review and discussion
- Board unanimously supported proposed map Option 1 for the following two reasons:
  - Displaces the fewest residents
  - Most closely matches existing district boundaries
- No specific boundary changes based upon known addresses of citizens
- Board consensus was to have the process be as open and transparent as possible and free from political influence






## 2022 Proposed Map

WHAT WILL BE THE IMPACT ON RESIDENTS?

- The Proposed Redistricting Map will redistrict 2,623 residents.
  - District 1 → District 4 (17 residents)
  - District 6 → District 1 (292 residents)
  - District 5 → District 6 (210 residents)
  - District 2 → District 6 (542 residents)
  - District 6 → District 5 (714 residents)
  - District 3 → District 2 (848 residents)

#### **Next Steps**

WHAT IS THE TIMELINE FOR THIS PROCESS?

- First reading of proposed ordinance tonight
- Second reading and final action February 17th
- New district boundaries will go into effect upon approval
- Impacted residents would vote for their new Trustee candidates beginning with the 2023 consolidated elections
