Subject: FY2020 Vehicle Replacements

Included in the FY2020 budget is the replacement of 4 Police Department squad cars and 1 Fire Department vehicle. The 2020 model Ford Interceptor Utility features a hybrid drive system which Ford claims to increase fuel efficiency by 40%. A non-hybrid version is still available and cost \$3,265 less however the higher initial cost of the hybrid will be offset by the 40% projected fuel savings over the life of the vehicle. Below is a summary of the cars to be replaced and the amount budgeted. The lead time for these vehicles can be significant so staff would like Board approval to order these cars now.

The Ford Interceptor Utility is available for joint purchase through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC contract #152). The current contract winner for the SPC is Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL).

I recommend the Board of Trustees waive bid and award a contract to Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL) in the amount of \$201,842 for 5 new Ford Hybrid Police Interceptor Utilities. I also recommend declaring Village unit numbers PP749, PP750, PP751, PP795 and FA1 as surplus per the attached ordinance and authorize their sale at public auction. Waiver of first reading is requested on this ordinance. Please submit this item to the Village Board for their consideration at the November 21, 2019 meeting.

ORDINANCE _____

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION OF PERSONAL
PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard to sell said personal property at public auction to be held by Obenauf Auction Service. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF
TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:**

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard, at public auction, by Obenauf Auction Service to the highest bidder on said property. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard.

Section 3: The Village Manager is hereby authorized and may direct Obenauf Auction Service to advertise the sale of the aforementioned personal property in a newspaper published within the community before the date of said public auction.

Section 4: No bid which is less than the minimum price set forth in the list of property to be sold shall be accepted.

Section 5: The Village Manager or his designee shall cause to be transferred any titles or other legal documents pursuant to the sale.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
