Re: Proposed Command Vehicle Purchase

History

As you know, the police department currently has a mobile command vehicle that was purchased in 1994 that is used for major crime scene evidence recovery, a mobile command post, major community events, and other incidents where a visual police presence is required. Our current command vehicle is a 1994 Chevrolet P-30 twenty-one foot step van equipped with cabinets, a single work station with one computer, radio communication equipment, and a small seating area. When this vehicle was purchased in 1994, it was a significant improvement over a converted ambulance donated by our fire department that we were utilizing at the time. Our current command vehicle has served us well during the last fourteen years but our needs have outgrown its capabilities and it has become worn and outdated.

Knowing the command vehicle needed to be replaced in early 2007, we began assessing our command vehicle needs based upon changes in technology and operational protocols including incident command. This review revealed the need for significantly more space to accommodate multiple work stations, operational command meetings and advanced communication and surveillance equipment. After assessing our needs, Lt. Wirsing and Sgt. Newton contacted other agencies with command vehicles to gather information including sizing, layout, accessories, equipment, costs, and vendor experience and they visited several agencies and toured their vehicles along with our fleet maintenance personnel. These vehicles ranged in cost from \$150,000 to over \$500,000.

Based upon our needs and limited funds, they focused on vehicles that were in the 30 to 36 foot range that would not exceed \$200,000 in cost. After viewing a vehicle from Farber Specialty Vehicles, police and fleet personnel visited the Farber facility in Columbus, Ohio in late April, 2008. After reviewing our space and functionality needs,

I respectfully recommend funding the vehicle as follows:

The expenditure of these funds for the purchase of the Mobile Command Vehicle has been reviewed by Assistant Village Attorney Wagner who concurs that this use of these funds is permissible under Illinois statute.

Our State and Federal Drug Seizure accounts have respective balances of \$77,316 and \$54,433. The use of \$2,500 from each account would be a permitted expenditure as our mobile command vehicle is partially used for drug investigations.

Our DUI Equipment Tech, account # 1010.334552, has a current balance of \$141,270. These proceeds come from DUI offenders and must be used to purchase law enforcement equipment and commodities that will assist in the prevention of alcohol related criminal violence throughout the State. Our mobile command vehicle is used during DUI Check Points, serious traffic crashes involving alcohol, and other alcohol related crimes making the use of these funds to purchase a new mobile command vehicle a qualifying expenditure.

Since our current mobile command vehicle was purchased using state and federal drug seizures in 1994, no general fund accumulated reserve fund was established. However, an accumulated reserve funded from State and Federal drug seizures was established and has a balance of \$47,000.

Funding

The design and specification developed by Farber was reviewed at our May 21st staff meeting with concurrence on the specifications. Based upon some minor change recommendations, an updated drawing and quotation was prepared by Farber and the modified design was again reviewed by staff and investigators. There is staff concurrence that the size and design will meet our needs for the foreseeable future. We also have concurrence from Fire Chief Seagraves that the new Mobile Command Vehicle will meet the Emergency Management needs of the Village.

Procurement Program

Farber worked with us to design and specify a 33 foot mobile command vehicle that meets every specification we provided with a cost of \$192,385 when purchased under General Services Administration (GSA) contract pricing. Farber Specialty Vehicle manufactures mobile command vehicles for numerous Federal and foreign agencies as well as state and local police agencies throughout the United States. Farber Specialty Vehicles is an authorized GSA supplier and we are able to purchase under the GSA contract as a law enforcement agency involved in counter-drug activities under the GSA 1122 program. We have received written authorization from the Illinois State Police to purchase the vehicle under Section 1122 of the General Services Administration Procurement Program.

I believe that a thorough review of our needs in a mobile command vehicle was made as well as a review of available manufacturers. Based upon the recommendation of our staff, I respectfully recommend that we purchase the specified mobile command vehicle from Farber Specialty Vehicles, Inc. at the GSA price of \$192,385.00.

Recommendation

Because this new command vehicle is larger than our current model, parking in our existing police sally port will not be possible. Given the pending Space Needs Analysis and the uncertainty of the status of the police building expansion, the new vehicle will need to be parked outside until we get a larger police building.

Our current mobile command vehicle will be utilized until the new vehicle is delivered sometime in January, 2009. The current mobile command vehicle has a current approximate value of \$10,000. Area police departments have expressed an interest in purchasing our old vehicle once the new vehicle is placed in operation. Disposal will be addressed at that time and should not be an issue.

In addition, we intend to begin setting aside funds for future replacement of this vehicle. It is anticipated that this vehicle will have a 15 year useful life, and the cost to replace this vehicle at that time will be \$300,000, assuming a 3% increase in cost each year. This means that \$20,000 will be set aside each year for replacement, and these funds will come from the same accounts indicated above. There should be sufficient money to cover the annual replacement amount, in addition to purchasing items that we have previously purchased from these accounts, such as radar guns and alcohol analyzers.

The new vehicle will need to be equipped with radios, exterior lettering, and other specialty equipment that may likely cost approximately \$12,000 once the vehicle is delivered in the estimated 150 days from date of the order. The exact costs for the lettering, radios, and specialty equipment will need to be determined once the vehicle is delivered. These costs can be funded from our State and Federal drug seizure accounts that will have respective balances of \$74,816 and \$51,933.

Dane,

Sgt. Roy Newton and I did research into selecting a mobile command post. Based on location and needs we decided to narrow our search to three companies. Dodgen Industries, LDV, Inc. and Farber.

Dodgen Industries is located in Humboldt, Iowa. Dodgen had a 32' command vehicle that they offered for roughly \$150,000 including some additions. The Addison Police Department recently had purchased this vehicle and brought it to the Lombard Police Department to show it. I did not like the over all appearance of the vehicle or the layout of the interior. I did not feel that it utilized its space efficiently. I felt that the general quality was sufficient but was unsure how long it would last. Dan Coipo was able to tour the vehicle as well and advised that he did not like the design of the electrical wiring or the exhaust system.

LDV, Inc is located in Burlington, Wisconsin, and is considered one of the industry leaders in production of command vehicles. LDV, had recently sold a command vehicle to Northwest Suburban Major Crime Assistance Team. This vehicle is stored at the Arlington Heights Police Department. Sgt. Newton and I also toured this vehicle. The vehicle appeared to be well made but some features were not that desirable. This vehicle was narrow due to the closets on both sides of the body of the unit. Although this vehicle was larger than our estimated needs it was purchased for approximately \$500000 fully equipped. Vehicles that were more appropriate for our needs were listed in the 300000 range on LDV's website.

Sgt. Newton also toured Aurora Police Department's command vehicle purchased by LDV with similar observations.

Dan Coipo had an opportunity to visit Farber's plant in Columbus, Ohio and advised that he was pleased with the design and cost of their vehicles. Sgt. Newton and I looked over their plans and photo's of similar vehicles and agreed that it met the department need.

Other issues that arose during the research of vehicle selection were that it was difficult to find any other area departments that had a command vehicle that wasn't already represented by Dodgen or LDV. Many manufactures were not in the general area. For example La Boit Inc is located in Gahanna, Ohio but had only recently sold a command vehicle in our size range to a department in Florida.
