Re:

Mobile Radio Problems

Beginning January 1, 2006 the Illinois Fire Emergency Network (IFERN) will be using a private line tone squelch. In other words, our radios must have this capability so that we may converse on this frequency. This frequency is utilized when we respond to other towns and is a statewide frequency.

We had hoped to address this matter as we replaced vehicles, such as with the recent Engine 43 replacement. Unfortunately, the State's schedule is ahead of ours and we have three (3) mobile units that need to be replaced immediately. These mobile units are located in Engine 46, Engine 44 and Truck 52.

Fortunately, the answer will not be too painful. I recommend that we go ahead and replace these antiquated radios, which are 25 years old now using money from the vehicle replacement accounts. This is where the money would have come from and in all probability there would be an overall savings by purchasing the radios now. These radios in the past have been moved from vehicle to vehicle and I a do not see a problem with continuing this practice.

The next issues on the horizon are the capability of adding frequencies that are narrow band and the changing of some of our frequencies from broad band to narrow band. The new radios have the capability of doing this; however, these current radios do not.

The estimated cost is \$4,700 for the radios. Village staff can do the installation. Additionally, there would be some other minor costs for installation supplies estimated at less than \$100.00 per unit. The total cost excluding labor is \$14,400.

By moving forward, time is now on our side. Ordering can take between one (1) to two (2) months. We also can schedule the installations to the benefit of Fleet Services and the Fire Department.

I have attached a memo from Brian Stuart that gives more detail about the radios.
