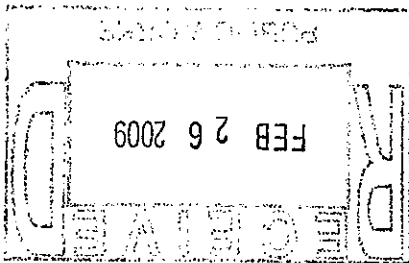
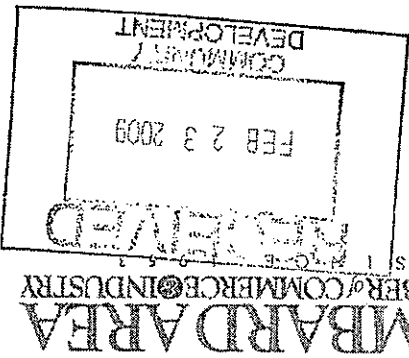

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 9, CHAPTER 97, AND TITLE 15,
CHAPTER 153 OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE IN REGARD TO
DIRECTIONAL STREET SIGNS

ORDINANCE NO. 3656

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the
Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Title 9, Chapter 97 of the Lombard Village
Code is amended by adding new Sections 97.300 and 97.301 thereto,
which shall read in their entirety as follows:

"§97.300 DIRECTIONAL STREET SIGN; DEFINED.

For purposes of this code, a "Directional Street Sign" shall be defined as follows: A sign located within the public right-of-way, which provides only a name and direction arrow indicating the location of a not-for-profit organization's facility, a governmental entity's (school district, park district, library) facility, or the historic downtown area of the Village (that area of downtown Lombard located within the boundaries of the Village's T.I.F. District).

§97.301 DIRECTIONAL STREET SIGNS; REQUESTS AND REQUIREMENTS.

As defined by Section 97.300, all Directional Street Signs shall comply with the following provisions:

(A) **Written Requests.** All requests for the erection of a Directional Street Sign shall be in writing, shall be submitted to the Village's Director of Public Works, or his/her designee, and shall contain the following information:

- (1) the proposed contents of the sign; and
 - (2) the requested location for the sign.
- (B) **Number.** Except in regard to Directional Street Signs relative to Village facilities, the following restrictions shall apply:

- (1) Each not-for-profit organization shall be allowed to request no more than two (2) Directional Street Signs per facility owned/used by said organization within the Village;

- (2) Each governmental entity shall be allowed to request no more than two (2) Directional Street Signs per facility owned/maintained by said entity within the Village, however, upon a showing of good cause for the need for more than two (2) Directional Street Signs, the President and Board of Trustees may authorize additional signs; and
- (3) No more than two (2) Directional Street Signs shall be erected in regard to the historic downtown area, however, upon a showing of good cause for the need for more than two (2) Directional Street Signs, the President and Board of Trustees may authorize additional signs; and
- (C) Size and Format. Except in regard to Directional Street Signs relative to Village facilities, the following size and format restrictions shall apply:
 - (1) Directional Street Signs for shall be no larger than eighteen (18) inches by thirty (30) inches;
 - (2) Directional Street Signs shall consist of four (4) inch white lettering on a blue background with a white border;
 - (3) Not more than two (2) Directional Street Signs shall be allowed on any one (1) street sign pole; and
 - (4) No Directional Street Sign shall be illuminated.
- (D) Location. Except in regard to Directional Street Signs relative to Village facilities, the following location restrictions shall apply:
 - (1) Directional Street Signs shall only be mounted onto existing Village street sign poles; and
 - (2) Although an organization or entity may request a specific location for its Directional Street Sign(s), Directional Street Signs shall only be located at those locations approved by the Village's Director of Public Works, or his/her designee.

(E) Financial Responsibilities. Prior to the preparation and erection of any Directional Street Sign, the organization or entity requesting said sign shall deposit with the Village an amount equal to the estimated cost of preparing and erecting said sign. If the actual cost is more than the amount deposited, the organization or entity shall be responsible for paying any additional amount due. If the actual cost is less than the amount deposited, the Village shall refund any overpayment to the organization or entity. In the event an existing Directional Street Sign needs to be replaced, payment for said replacement shall be handled in the same manner as for a new Directional Street Sign as set forth above."

SECTION 2: That the definition of "DIRECTIONAL STREET SIGN,"

as contained in Title 15, Chapter 153, Section 153.04 of the

Lombard Village Code, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3: That Title 15, Chapter 153, Section 153.40 of the

Lombard Village Code is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and

effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in

pamphlet form as provided by law.
