

ORDINANCE NO. 4647

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 152 OF THE LOMBARD VILLAGE CODE IN REGARD TO STREET NAMING AND ADDRESSING

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Title 15, Chapter 152, Section 152.20 of the Lombard Village Code is amended by revising the first sentence thereof, prior to subsection (A), to read in its entirely as follows:

"All buildings situated or hereafter erected or located on any dedicated right-ofway (except an alley) or any private street within the Village shall be numbered by the owner or occupant thereof according to the following plan:"

SECTION 2: That Title 15, Chapter 152 of the Lombard Village Code is amended by adding a new Section 152.27 thereto which shall read in its entirety as follows:

"152.27 HONORARY STREET NAMES

- (A) The Village Board may, by Ordinance, authorize the naming of a driveway on public property or a dedicated alley with an honorary street name. No dedicated right-of-way, other than an alley, shall be named with an honorary street name. A requestor shall make application for such designation to the Fire Chief. The Fire Chief shall seek comments from the Police Chief and Director of Community Development, and shall forward a recommendation to the Village Board. If approved by the Village Board, the Fire Chief shall have an approved honorary street name sign erected by the Public Works Department. The cost of the sign and installation will be paid for by the requestor unless such costs are waived by the Village Board. The Fire Chief shall notify any agencies that might be impacted by the honorary street naming."
- (B) There shall be no addressing of buildings based upon the honorary street name.
- (C) The Director of Public Works shall adopt an Honorary Street Signpost Policy pursuant to which honorary street signs shall be designed to clearly indicates that the street name set forth thereon is an honorary street name, and not the recognized name of the driveway or alley in question.

SECTION 3: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
