No parking on south side of 16th Street from Main St. to Highland Ave.

A parking issue was brought forward by Ms. Ilene Wyland of 1614 Charlotte Court. Christ the King Church and School are located on 15<sup>th</sup> Street. During Sunday church service and other special events, parking on both sides of 16<sup>th</sup> Street poses a passing hazard. There is adequate parking on the church property, at Manor Hill School, Four Seasons Park and on the north side of 16<sup>th</sup> Street. There are sidewalks, pedestrian crossing markings and an exclusive pedestrian crossing phase at the signalized intersection of Main Street and 16<sup>th</sup> Street for parking across Main Street. A copy of the enclosed letter was sent to area residents. No comments were received.

Staff recommends a change to the Village Traffic Code to post, "No Parking" on the south side of 16<sup>th</sup> Street, between Main Street and Highland Avenue.
