On Sunday, September 8, 2024, at approximately 1:10 p.m., the Lombard Fire Department responded to a reported fire inside the attached garage of a single-family home. Crews were initially dispatched to the 900 block of S. Grace Street, but dispatchers quickly received corrected information and responding units were redirected to the proper location on the 900 block of N. Grace Street.




While en route, firefighters could see a plume of thick, black smoke confirming an active fire. The first Lombard Fire Department unit arrived at 1:13 p.m. to find heavy fire fully engulfing the garage, which contained multiple vehicles. Smoke was also visible from the roof, indicating fire spread into the attic. A power line, severed by the intense heat, fell onto the driveway, temporarily complicating firefighting efforts. ComEd was called to the scene and safely removed the downed line.

Crews quickly began attacking the fire with the first hose line directed at the garage and subsequent hose lines being deployed inside and around the home. Firefighters cut a ventilation hole in the roof to allow heat and smoke to escape, improving conditions for crews working inside the home. Though efforts to control the fire extension into the home were hampered by a partial roof collapse, the fire was declared under control at 1:52 p.m. With the help of a tow truck, multiple vehicles were pulled from the garage to allow firefighters to fully extinguish the remaining hot spots.

There were no injuries to residents or firefighters. However, firefighters located a pet inside the home, which sadly did not survive. The home has been declared uninhabitable, with damages estimated at over \$500,000. The cause of the fire remains under investigation by the Lombard Fire Investigation Unit.

Lombard firefighters were assisted at the scene by Elmhurst and Villa Park Fire Departments, as well as Addison and York Center Fire Protection Districts. Lombard Police provided traffic and crowd control. During the fire, Lombard fire stations were backfilled by a Carol Stream engine and a Wheaton ambulance.




