# VILLAGE OF LOMBARD VILLAGE BOARD POLICY MEMORANDUM

Subject: <u>Backyard Drainage Program</u>

## I. Purpose

The purpose of this program is to eliminate flood-prone backyards through cooperative efforts by the Village of Lombard and effected residents.

#### II. Procedures/Guidelines

- A. Interested homeowners who can demonstrate that eight (8) or more contiguous properties are directly effected by backyard flooding can apply for a grant for 50% of the costs to install a backyard drainage system. "Directly effected" means that the property is subject to standing water for more than 72 hours.
- B. Eligible costs may include surveying, engineering, permits, and construction work including connection to public storm sewer and street restoration.
- C. Homeowner groups initiate projects and perform surveying and prepare engineering plans by a Professional Engineer. Plans are submitted to Community Development Department for approval.
- D. Approved plans are eligible for a grant. Grant applications are submitted to Public Works along with approved plans.
- E. Drainage systems must include an appropriate restrictor.
- F. Upon successful completion of the work and final inspection, the Village will reimburse the homeowner group for 50% of the project costs.
- G. The annual Village contribution to this program will be determined in the Capital Improvement Program.
- H. Backyard drainage connections to combined and sanitary sewer systems are prohibited by current Village ordinance and will not be considered.
- I. Backyard pumping systems discharging to combined sewer areas that comply with current Village ordinance are also eligible for this program.
- J. Improvements constructed on private property will be operated and maintained by the owners, not the Village of Lombard.



**Backyard Flooding** 



There are two ways to manage these flooding areas: (1) by installing a backyard sewer line in areas where the storm and sanitary sewers are separate; or (2) by installing a backyard sump pump system to pump out the water according to the applicable Village ordinance. Both systems are expensive and complicated. The Village can assist residents in implementing these systems by providing assistance from staff and grant money.

I propose creating a backyard flooding grant program by which residents may apply for a grant with the Public Works Committee for 50/50 funding. The Board can control participation in the grant program by allocating a certain sum of money for the first year.
