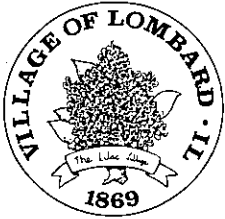

Subject: Permission to Enter into Negotiations with Waste Management- 2006 Contract

At the February 22, 2005 meeting, the Environmental Concerns Committee unanimously approved the following recommendation. "The Village agrees to enter into negotiations with Waste Management for the 2006 Solid Waste Contract with stipulations that Waste Management agrees to no rate increase for the last year of the current contract, and that a tentative agreement is reached no later than July 15, 2005." Note the current contract expires on March 31, 2006.

Under the current agreement for the period April 1, 2005 through March 31, 2006, Waste Management has the right to increase the residential and commercial rates a maximum of 3%. The Committee's intent is to provide an opportunity for Waste Management to negotiate because the firm has performed well during the years of this contract, but if terms cannot be reached by July 15th, the Committee recommends issuing a Request for Proposals. If negotiations fail, Waste Management would have the right to increase rates a maximum of 3% for the remainder of the current contract from that point forward. Also, if negotiations produce a tentative agreement, the Committee would recommend a waiver of bids by the Board and award of a contract to Waste Management.

The Committee asked Public Works to conduct a phone poll of the Village President and Board to obtain comments on the current contract for use in the proposed negotiations.
