SUBJECT: Fifth Amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement with York Township

regarding Route 53 and Madison Street

Background

In June 2010, the Village Board of Trustees approved the execution of an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with the York Township Highway Commissioner relative to improvements to the intersection of IL Route 53 and Madison Street. The agreement provided for the Village to make improvements to the unincorporated portions of Madison Street as part of the project. The estimated cost of the improvements in the unincorporated segment of the project was \$402,049, which will be paid for by the York Township Highway Commissioner.

In June 2012, the Village and the York Township Highway Commissioner executed the First Amendment to the IGA. The First Amendment to the IGA provided that the Commissioner would pave portions of School Street and 14th Street within Lombard's corporate limits as part of the Township's grind and overlay of the asphalt roadways in the former York Co-op. Under the First Amendment, the York Township Highway Commissioner paved 14th Street from Meyers Road to a point 750 feet west of the western right-of-way line of Westmore and a portion of School Street from Roosevelt Road to 14th Street. These roadways were annexed by the Village of Lombard in 2008 during the construction of the South Booster Station.

The portion of the improvement within the Village's right-of-way was estimated at \$208,935.75. As no funding source for the Village's contribution towards the York Co-op grind & overlay project was available at the time, the Village discussed the possibility of the York Township Highway Commissioner paying the full cost of the York Co-op improvements and have that amount deducted from the York Township Highway Commissioner's contribution towards the Route 53 and Madison Project. The First Amendment was approved by the Village Board on June 21, 2012.

In January 2014 the Village and the York Township Highway Commissioner executed the Second Amendment to the IGA. The Second Amendment sought to reduce the scope of the project due to the elimination of water and sanitary sewer through the unincorporated areas of

the project. This was done as a result of a survey that was conducted of the property owners. As a result of the project revisions, the following changes were made under the Second Amendment:

- Total Project cost was reduced from \$3,577,893 to \$3,314,503.
- The York Township Highway Commissioner's portion of the project costs were reduced from \$402,049 to \$307,497.

In June 2015 the Village and the Village and the York Township Highway Commissioner have executed the Third Amendment to the IGA, which provided that the Township resurface 20th Street between Main Street and Highland Avenue. Portions of the roadway are within the corporate limits of Lombard, while other sections are unincorporated territory. The work along 20th Street was estimated at \$90,124.40. Based upon the First, Second and Third Amendments to the IGA, the balance due from the York Township Highway Commissioner to the Village was reduced from \$98,652 to \$8,527.60.

In August 2016, the Village and Township Roadway Commissioner executed the 4th Amendment to the IGA that addressed an issue relative to the installation of street lighting on Madison Street. That amendment provided that the Village exclude the installation of the lighting along Madison Street until 24 months of IDOT completing the Route 53 reconstruction and widening.

The Village has completed the project and based upon the later than expected start of the project, due to the review and approvals by the Illinois Department of Transportation, the project deadlines, including those provisions of the IGA dealing with involuntary annexation are nearing expiration. The Township has requested consideration of a Fifth Amendment to the IGA, which would provide the following:

- Amending the term of the Village agreeing not to seek forcible annexation of the properties along Madison. The original IGA stated that the Village agreed not to seek annexation prior to January 1, 2018 and included a sliding scale for the Township's contribution to the project. The Village is agreeable to extending the date for the "forcible annexation moratorium" through January 1, 2023 and extending the provision for reimbursement through the revised date.
- 2. The Village and Township Commissioner agree to include a provision that should 50% or more of the unincorporated residents petition the Village for utility services, the provision of the forcible annexation is terminated and the Village could seek to annex the properties.
- 3. Amending the provision contained in the 4th Amendment to the IGA that provides that the Village will install street lighting along Madison Street within twenty-four (24) months of IDOT completing the RT. 53 reconstruction and widening project to a term of sixty (60) month from the date that IDOT completes the reconstruction and widening project.

The Village Attorney has reviewed the agreement and the York Township Highway Commissioner has executed the agreement. I would request that this matter be placed on the

Village Board agenda for the June 15, 2017 meeting. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me. I thank you for your time and consideration of this matter.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Village Board of Trustees approve the Fifth Amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement with York Township regarding Route 53 and Madison Street.

FIFTH AMENDMENT TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD AND THE YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER REGARDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MADISON STREET

This FIFTH AMENDMENT TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (the "FIFTH AMENDMENT") is entered into this _____ day of ______, 2017, by and between the VILLAGE OF LOMBARD (the "VILLAGE") and the YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER (the "COMMISSIONER"). The VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER are hereinafter sometimes referred to collectively as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER entered into AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD AND THE YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER REGARDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MADISON STREET, dated June 17, 2010 (the "ORIGINAL AGREEMENT); and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER entered into a FIRST AMENDMENT TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD AND THE YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER REGARDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MADISON STREET, dated June 21, 2012 (the "FIRST AMENDMENT"); and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER entered into a SECOND AMENDMENT TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD AND THE YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER REGARDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MADISON STREET, dated January 16, 2014 (the "SECOND AMENDMENT"); and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER entered into a THIRD AMENDMENT TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF

LOMBARD AND THE YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER REGARDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MADISON STREET, dated July 16, 2015 (the "THIRD AMENDMENT"); and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER entered into a FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD AND THE YORK TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER REGARDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MADISON STREET, dated August 18, 2016 (the "FOURTH AMENDMENT" – the ORIGINAL AGREEMENT as amended by the FIRST AMENDMENT, the SECOND AMENDMENT, the THIRD AMENDMENT and the FOURTH AMENDMENT being hereinafter referred to as the "AMENDED AGREEMENT"); and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER desire to amend certain provisions of the AMENDED AGREEMENT, relative to annexation of the properties abutting the ROADWAY (as defined in the AMENDED AGREEMENT), and street lighting relative to the PROJECT (as defined in the AMENDED AGREEMENT); and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and 5 ILCS 220/1 through 220/9 provide authority for intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the VILLAGE and the COMMISSIONER to enter into this FIFTH AMENDMENT;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- That Section 7 of the AMENDED AGREEMENT is hereby revised as follows:
 - A. The reference to "January 1, 2018," as contained therein, is revised to read, "January 1, 2023."
 - B. The following language shall be added to the end thereof: "Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event that the owners of fifty percent (50%) or more of the lineal feet of unincorporated frontage abutting upon the ROADWAY petition the

VILLAGE for utility service (water and sanitary sewer service), the VILLAGE shall not be precluded from annexing properties within the limits of the PROJECT, and, upon any such annexation by the VILLAGE, no monetary refund shall be due the COMMISSIONER under this Section and Exhibit "C" attached hereto."

- 2. That Section 15 of the AMENDED AGREEMENT is hereby amended by revising the reference therein to "twenty-four (24) months," to read, "sixty (60) months."
- 3. That the AMENDED AGREEMENT is hereby amended by adding the following to the end of Exhibit "C":

"If the VILLAGE annexes the property between January 1, 2018 and December 31, 2018, the VILLAGE shall reimburse to the COMMISSIONER ten percent (10%) of the COMMISSIONER'S PROJECT costs, as calculated pursuant to Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

If the VILLAGE annexes the property between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2019, the VILLAGE shall reimburse to the COMMISSIONER seven and one-half percent (7.5%) of the COMMISSIONER'S PROJECT costs, as calculated pursuant to Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

If the VILLAGE annexes the property between January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020, the VILLAGE shall reimburse to the COMMISSIONER five percent (5%) of the COMMISSIONER'S PROJECT costs, as calculated pursuant to Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

If the VILLAGE annexes the property between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021, the VILLAGE shall reimburse to the COMMISSIONER two and one-half percent (2.5%) of the COMMISSIONER'S PROJECT costs, as calculated pursuant to Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

If the VILLAGE annexes the property between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022, the VILLAGE shall reimburse to the COMMISSIONER one percent (1%) of the COMMISSIONER'S PROJECT costs, as calculated pursuant to Section 6 of this AGREEMENT."

- That all portions of the AMENDED AGREEMENT, not amended hereby, shall remain in full force and effect.
- This FIFTH AMENDMENT shall be executed simultaneously in two (2) counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but both of which shall constitute one and the same FIFTH AMENDMENT.
