

Subject: FY2018 Vehicle Replacements

Included in the FY2018 budget is the replacement of four Police Department squad cars. As a cost savings measure the replacement squads will no longer be two-tone in color (black and white). The new cars will be all black with refreshed "police" graphics. This change will save the Village approximately \$1,700 per car because the doors will not have to be painted white and the re-sale value is higher for solid color cars. The Police Department currently has fourteen "black and white" squad cars so this change will save about \$23,800 every five years or the life cycle of a squad car. Below is a summary of the squad cars that staff is requesting to be replaced with Ford Interceptor Utilities;

The Ford Interceptor Utility is available for joint purchase through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC). The current contract winner for the SPC is Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL). The four Ford Interceptor Utilities with the ready for the road package cost \$125,056. The budgeted amount for this purchase is \$132,000.

I recommend the Board of Trustees award a contract to Currie Motors of Frankfort (IL) in the amount of \$125,056 for four new Ford Police Interceptor Utilities. I also recommend declaring Village unit numbers 743, 745, 747 and 794 as surplus per the attached ordinance and authorize their sale at public auction. Please submit this item to the Village Board for their consideration at the December 7, 2017 meeting.

ORDINANCE _____

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION OF PERSONAL
PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lombard, it is no longer necessary or useful to or in the best interest for the Village of Lombard to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lombard to sell said personal property at public auction to be held by Obenauf Auction Service. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LOMBARD, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the President and Board of Trustees find the following described property:

now owned by the Village of Lombard is no longer necessary or useful to the Village of Lombard and the best interests of the Village of Lombard will be served by its sale.

Section 2: Pursuant to said 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Village President and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforementioned personal property now owned by the Village of Lombard, at public auction, by Obenauf Auction Service to the highest bidder on said property. Vehicles valued less than the cost of auction fees and would not result in a net profit for the Village shall be sold directly to a salvage yard.

Section 3: The Village Manager is hereby authorized and may direct Obenauf Auction Service to advertise the sale of the aforementioned personal property in a newspaper published within the community before the date of said public auction.

Section 4: No bid which is less than the minimum price set forth in the list of property to be sold shall be accepted.

Section 5: The Village Manager or his designee shall cause to be transferred any titles or other legal documents pursuant to the sale.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
