Subject: Hotel/Motel Tax Expenditures for Fiscal Year 2019

Attached for your review is a Historical Budget Analysis regarding proposed Hotel/Motel Tax expenditures for FY 2019 (Attachment 1). Below is a financial summary of Hotel/Motel Tax revenue and expenditures for FY17, the FY18 budget, FY18 year-end estimate, and the FY19 proposed budget.

As shown above, based on current year-to-date collections, FY19 revenues are projected to have no change (0.00%) compared to the FY18 budget. The FY19 budget request is \$148,140 (-6.59%) less than the FY18 budget. The significant decrease in the FY19 budget is due to a diligent effort on Village staff's part to review expenditure history.

Significant increases to the Hotel Motel fund included in the FY19 budget include \$9,900 for salaries and benefits, \$10,000 for a one-time upgrade to the employee intranet, \$7,300 for repairs and improvements to the Historical Museum, \$7,500 for banners, \$6,000 for miscellaneous overtime for community events, and \$3,870 for miscellaneous grants.

Significant decreases to the Hotel Motel fund included in the FY19 budget are \$8,740 for printing, mailing, and postage costs associated with the reduction of issues of the Lombard Pride, \$5,000 for winter decorations, \$8,470 for DuPage Convention & Visitors' Bureau payments, \$27,500 for Lilac Town Centre personnel expenses, \$5,000 electronic communication and marketing, and \$125,000 that was included in FY18 for the public information notification signage.

Staff will be in attendance at the Committee meeting on August 6, 2018 to review the proposed Hotel/Motel Tax expenditures.
