The Plan Commission did recommend approval, but the Village has learned there are on-going discussions with the Library relative to parking and there is a question relative to the number of spaces available at the church lot.

Trustee Fugiel noted that the church is already 24 spaces short of the required parking and this added day care would impact parking significantly. He felt the Board needed clarification on the parking prior to voting on the matter.
